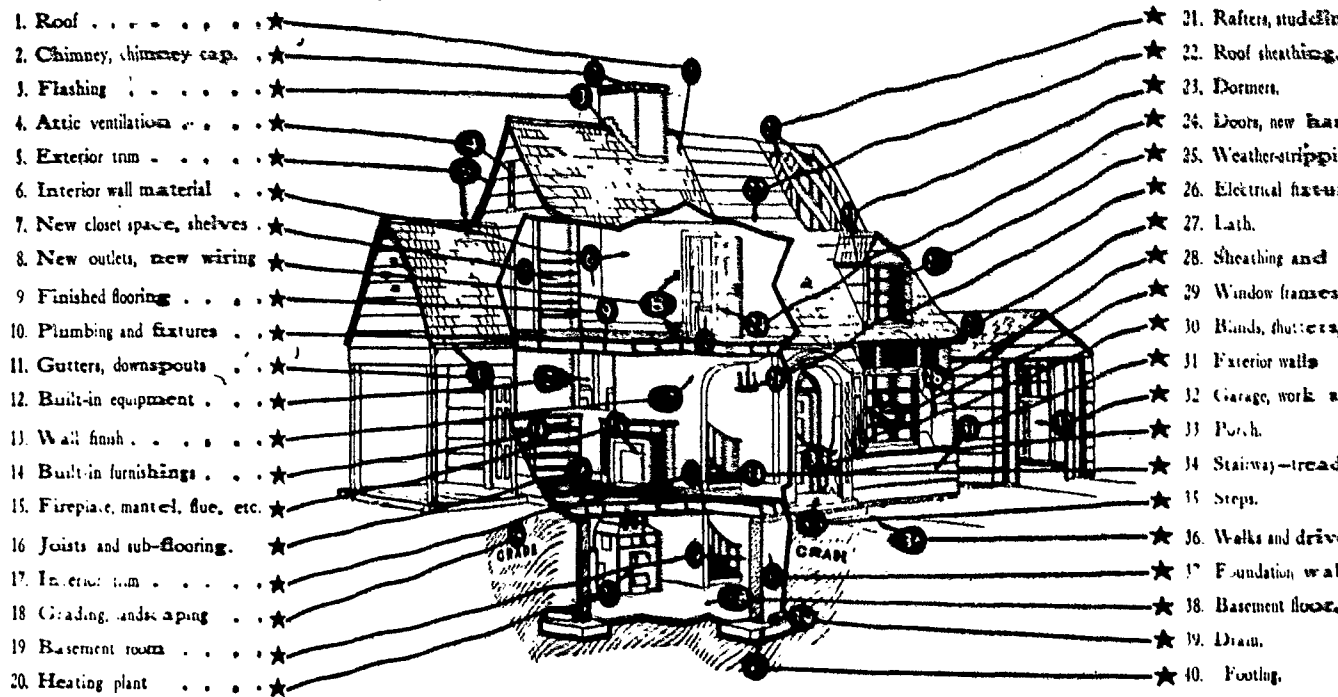

**MISSION INTENTION:** That the students of Catholic Schools may be taught about the Missions.

Through the paternal solicitude of the Holy Father, we reserve the May Mission intention for the younger members of his flock in his capacity as head of the universal Church. He realizes that these will be the leaders of the next generation into whose hands must pass the standard which heralds the possible realization of Christ's own mandate to teach all nations.

In his "Rerum Ecclesiae" His Holiness Pope Pius XI had already issued his appeal to the children attending Catholic institutions of learning. "We desire," he said, "that in all institutions and orphan asylums in parochial schools in colleges and in religious houses of women there should be recited to Heaven every day a prayer that the Divine Mercy may descend upon so many unhappy beings and upon such populous pagan nations. What can the Heavenly Father refuse to grant to the innocent and chaste."

In this same memorable document the Holy Father also states: "For this reason you will do a thing conformable to Our desire and in keeping with the mind and sentiments of the faith if some special prayer for the missions and for the conversion of the heathen to the true faith be added to the rosary and to other such prayers as are accustomed to be recited in the parish churches and in other churches and LET THE CHILDREN BE INVITED AND ENCOURAGED TO THIS END."

**Apply Zinc Paint In Warm Weather**

Best results are obtained when applying zinc paint to iron or steel on warm days. All rust should first be carefully removed from the surface to be coated. To apply paint on galvanized or zinc coated surfaces, best results are obtained when the surfaces are allowed to weather for about six months. Paint will adhere better to such a surface which becomes roughened slightly from exposure. A similar condition can be produced on unweathered zinc or galvanized surfaces by painting them with a dilute solution of copper sulphate, copper acetate or copper chloride using four ounces to a gallon of water. The surface should be allowed to dry completely before applying paint.
