Conventions At Ithaca Votes To Combat All 'Red' Activities

(Special to Catholic Courier) ITHACA—A determination to work against subversive forces, and the spread of indecent literature and for peace and the retention of the Neutrality Act was expressed in resolutions adopted here at the annual convention of the Central New York Province of the Federation of College Catholic Clubs, Saturday and Sunday.

Combined with the convention program on Sunday was a Communion breakfast marking the 50th anniversary of the Cornell Newman Club.

Honoring the "three great mothers" Dr. Code said that "if the American people knew the real facts of the Spanish Leftist propaganda setup in this country, they would demand of Congress and the State Department not the repeal of the Neutrality Act allegedly to help the Spanish Leftists, but the recall of Spanish Leftist Ambassadors at Washington and his whole staff of propagandists."

At the conclusion of the two addresses, the Rev. Donald M. Cleary, Catholic chaplain at Cornell, presented Professor George Cavanaugh with the highest distinction the Newman Club confers, the honor key, in recognition of "50 years active service in the organization at Cornell."

There is a definite connection between the three mothers, the Bishop stated. "Our identity or loyalty to one of them, determines our identity or loyalty to the others."

Speaking of the third mother, Bishop Kearney referred to the retention of religion to education and stated that "you may never be asked you to sacrifice the dearest thing in your life your faith in God, and your devotion to your religion."

He refuted the misrepresentation which, he said, the tradition of Cornell has suffered as a "Godless place." Tracing this misconception to its non-sectarian origin, he affirmed that one of the first steps taken was the establishment of religious worship. Our university stands pre-eminently for the cultivation of the intellectual life, he stated.

Robert J. McDonald, Cornell student, was toastmaster of the breakfast.

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21 POINTS MADE

(Continued from Page 1) That collective bargaining should be recognized as a basic right of labor.

That the minimum wage standards be set up by law for labor unprotected by collective bargaining.

That the legitimacy of the profit motive in the development and conduct of business be frankly recognized, and its control in the interest of the common good should not aim at its extinction.

That there must be an increase of wealth produced, if there is to be an adequate increase of wealth distributed.

That a proper objective of monetary policy is to avoid rapid and violent fluctuations in commodity prices.

That the State should insure the productive life to industry, he should be assured of security against illness and dependent old age.

That a balance must be maintained between industrial and agricultural population and between the rewards for industrial and agricultural activity.

That a healthy agricultural system will encourage the family farm rather than the commercial farm.

That the family, rather than the individual, is the social and economic unit; and its needs should be recognized both by industry and by the State.

That there are natural rights possessed by human persons and families which God has given and which the State cannot abrogate.

That a Christian Social Order can be maintained only on the basis of a full acceptance of the person and the teachings of Jesus Christ.

That a Christian Social Order involves decent housing for all the people.

That this convention and the delegates hereto do everything possible to further the interests of peace among individuals, racial and religious groups, and nations.

That the members of the Central New York Province of the Federation of College Catholic Clubs are unalterably opposed to the exhibition for sale or loan or distribution upon newspapers and other public places which offer for sale books, papers and magazines in and about the several communities within the district embraced by this province.

That the delegates hereto to affect the welfare of its citizens and to violate the laws of the State of New York, in this connection, this organization petitions that the proper authorities make due investigation and take such action as may be necessary to rectify the evil of the present existing conditions, to prevent in the future the sale or distribution of any but decent and wholesome books, magazines, writings, pictures, printed matter and the like to which campaign of decency this organization sincerely pledges its earnest cooperation.

That the delegates of the convention go on record as favoring the retention of the Neutrality Act in its present form, as the best safeguard for the preservation of peace, not only between America and other nations, but also between these other nations themselves.
