One week from Sunday, June 5, is Pentecost, the day on which the Holy Ghost descended upon the Apostles. It is a very important feast for every Catholic, inasmuch as it celebrates the Birthday of our Church. You will recall from your Bible Study that the Apostles immediately began their missionary work and that very day about 3,000 people were baptized and became Catholics.

For you missionaries that you are this day is doubly important. It is known throughout the world as Mission Sunday of the Sick. Rather than gathering money or stamps or tinfol, we are putting aside this day for Mission Prayers and the prayer, not of everyone, but only of the sick. Those poor people who are confined to sick beds the shut-in of the world who are being invited to offer their sufferings and prayers for the spread of Christ's Kingdom.

You can help in gathering these prayers by inviting the sick whom you know to participate. Perhaps there is someone right in your own home or maybe next door who might assist the missions in this way. Just a word from you and they would be glad to join. Get a prayer card from your teacher and leave it with any sick person whom you know. Ask them to fill in the number of prayers they are offering for the missions, put a stamp on the card and it will be delivered to our office.

I am counting on you boys and girls to give us a hand in making Mission Sunday of the Sick most successful. As I have reminded you many times over prayers for the missions are our best gifts. Better than that are the prayers of the sick. Sufferings when borne for the sake of Christ, are the greatest of all prayers.

Last year about 500 people in the diocese joined in the devotion. One man offered his blindness for the success of the missions. With your help we can double this number.

And know that as usual, you will be right on the job.

- Q Can a garage door that can be controlled from a car be installed?
A Doors operated by motor can be equipped with a remote-control switch consisting of a key placed in a pad located at the side of the drive. Some types will open when the horn is sounded.
 - Q Steam and water leak out of the pipes near the radiators where the handle is that you turn Can you tell me how to fix them?
A The valves evidently need replacing. This is a job for the plumber and it would be inadvisable for an amateur to attempt it.
 - Q Can I have more base plugs put in some of our rooms?
A Yes, call in the electrician and he can figure out how it can be done. Don't let an amateur do it as he might overload a circuit or make a bad connection and create a fire hazard.
 - Q Is it possible to obtain a loan to enable me to build a new and secure foundation under my home?
A Ask your contractor about the cost and your banker about the loan. A stout foundation of concrete or masonry may replace the old one and prevent sagging, cracked walls and ceilings and building floors. This is considered an improvement and is eligible for a modernization loan.

MISSION INTENTION. "That Catholic Missions may be multiplied among Negroes of the United States."
During the month of June our prayers are directed toward a home mission problem namely, the American Negroes in the past few years we have noted a growing consciousness upon the part of Catholics toward the colored people. Created by the Almighty, drops of Precious Blood were shed for their salvation. Pray, then, that they may come to a knowledge of the one True God, to share in the merits won for them on the Tree of the Cross.

We include a letter from Reverend Mother Anne Dengel of the Society of Catholic Medical Missionaries. Her appeal is utterly urgent. The members of this rapidly growing community are destitute for want of space. The little frame building in which they are housed at present is entirely inadequate. Indeed, it would be a sad commentary on the generosity of the American Catholics if their all-tiveness permitted this condition to continue. The importance of their work can scarcely be realized and we cannot let them fall and discontinue for an instant their valued service.

I am sure you know of our overcrowded condition here at the Motherhouse and Novitiate. And I am sure that you know how impossible it is to build or buy unless we have the necessary funds. Our Motherhouse Fund is growing, but quickly it will not be possible to obtain larger quarters for another year or more. In the meantime we have over forty Sisters crowded into our small buildings that comfortably accommodate about fifteen.

It is for this reason that we appeal to you in the hope that you will be able to do something to help us financially.

Your donation toward the Motherhouse will be the means of properly housing one of those Sisters who, within a short time will be gaining for your benefactor untold spiritual merit. Send your offering to this office and we will hustle it along to Reverend Mother.
