Discussed at K. C. Communion Week.

GENEVA About 125 members of the Geneva Council of the Knights of Columbus and their guests attended the annual Communion Week at the Council on Sunday morning, May 23, at the Hotel Geneva after the 7:30 o'clock Mass at St. Francis DeSales church where the members received Holy Communion in a body.

Members of the Fourth Degree of the Knights of Columbus acted as escorts for the event appearing in colorful regalia.

Attorney James Ryan was the principal speaker at the breakfast. Mr. Ryan spoke on the Catholic layman's point of view on current world topics. Other speakers included the Rt. Rev. Messrs. Walter J. Lee of St. Francis DeSales church, Grand Knight Henry Hoffman and Acting Grand Knight Cornelius Tunney.

### Interest Increases in Lake Cruises

### Ukrainians To Honor Their Bishop at Auburn On Memorial Day

AUBURN A Pontifical Field Mass celebrated by His Excellency Most Rev. Constantine Bohachevsky, D.D., Ukrainian Catholic Bishop of Philadelphia, Pa., at Donville Park on Donville Lake Memorial Day will open the program for an elaborate celebration of "Ukrainian Catholic Day."

The Divine Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom in the Church Slavonic language according to the Ukrainian Rite of the Catholic Church will be followed in the Mass.

Father Pohorny and the Rev. Paul Turian of Rochester will assist the Bishop as Assistant Priests, the Rev. Michael Krawczyk and the Rev. John Zark of Buffalo will be Deacons of the Mass. The Rev. Francis Bonn of Buffalo will be Master of Ceremonies.

A sermon in Ukrainian will be preached by His Excellency, Bishop Bohachevsky and in English by the Very Rev. Dean John A. Conway, pastor of Holy Family Church.

Combined Ukrainian Church choirs of Auburn, Buffalo, Elmira, Syracuse and Rochester will sing during the Mass. Andrew Dzwonkowsky of Auburn will conduct the choir.

Bishop Bohachevsky will be guest of honor at a special "Ukrainian Catholic Day" dinner at Donville Park Hotel at 1 o'clock. Tomaszewski will be Deputy Altar.
