Niagara University is conducted by the Vincentian Fathers.

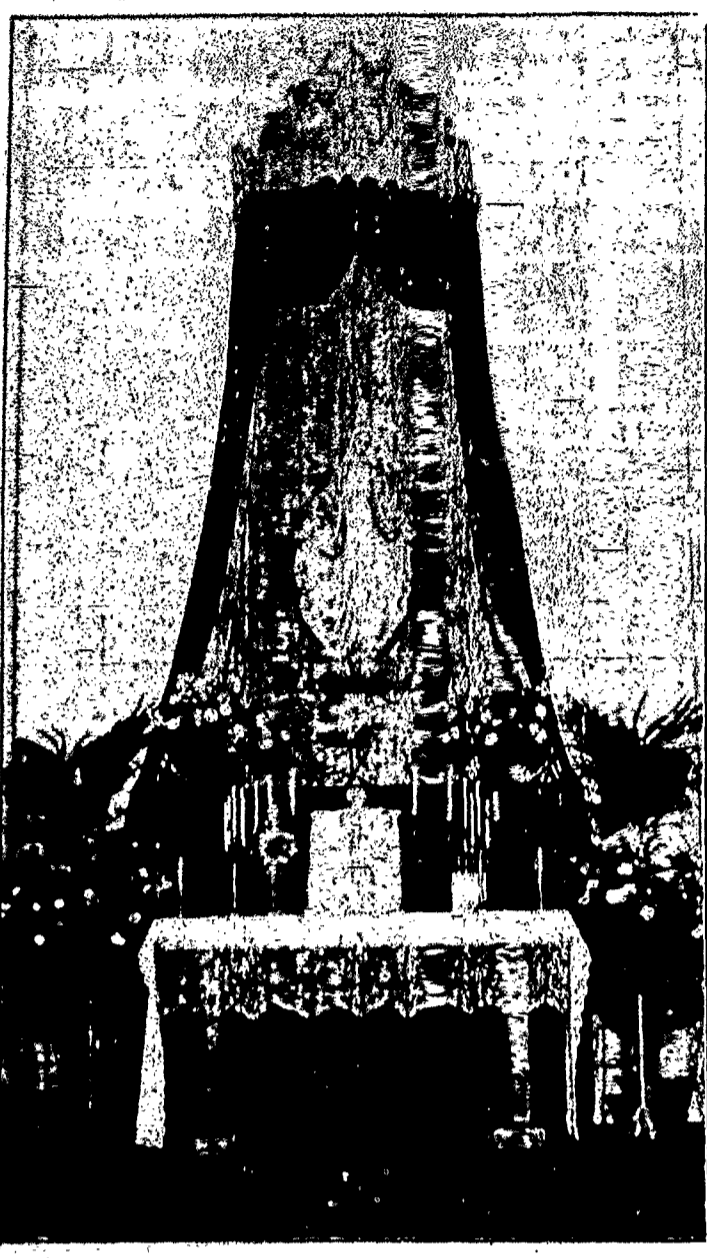
Cost To Present Comedy on June 6

Imposing Shrine Erected For Priests' Holy Hour



Before a beautiful Shrine in Columbus Circle, Centre Intra-city, the Shrine of Our Lady of the Holy Hour was erected for the monthly Holy Hour in May (See photo above). This particular devotion was dedicated to the Queen of May, and the Shrine was especially erected for the occasion.

The Holy Hour devotion for the priests has been held during the past year at the invitation of His Excellency, Bishop Kearney.

Crown of the Shrine is a wood frame covered with a triple string of gilded paper, encased in hand gilded and grained with ground glass. Cascading from the base of the Crown is a fringe of deep red, painted velvet lined with a rich, figured damask.

The same velvet covers the platform supporting both the Crown and the Shrine of Our Lady of the Holy Hour.

MISSION INTENTION That more Catholic Missions might be founded for the Negroes of the United States. The delegates to the Catholic Students Mission Crusade Rally held at Aquinas Institute, Ascension Thursday, resolved to solicit from the White population of the United States great love and consideration for the Negroes. They appealed that the colored people be treated by us in the spirit in which Christ would have desired we be of them in the name of His Holiness, Pope Pius XI, a daily prayer during the month that Negroes of this country would be accorded the benefits of our holy religion.

Suffering Beneficial Next Sunday is the feast of Penitence, and by request of His Holiness, Pope Pius XI, it will be observed as Mission Sunday of the Sick. On that day Catholics throughout the world who are despondent of the blessing of good health, are urged to unite in making this a time of prayer for the millions, less fortunate, who are still in the darkness of paganism. If personal sufferings are borne with fortitude and sanctified with prayer they become a mighty weapon for good. Then it is that weakness becomes strength. The Little Flower accomplished more for the missions on her bed of pain than many who actually journeyed to foreign fields. When the results of previous devotions were announced to the Holy Father, he replied: "Tell all our beloved sick how grateful the Pope is for his suffering. Mission Sunday of the Sick. Tell them that the Pope counts on their prayers and has an especial affection for them. Tell them that daily we beg for them in the favor of either health or Christian resignation. Tell them that with all our heart we beseech on them the Apostolic Blessing." We urge the sick and invalid to join in this world-wide devotion. Prayer cards may be obtained from the priests of your parish. However, in the event that you find this impossible, we are permitting this prayer for your convenience.
