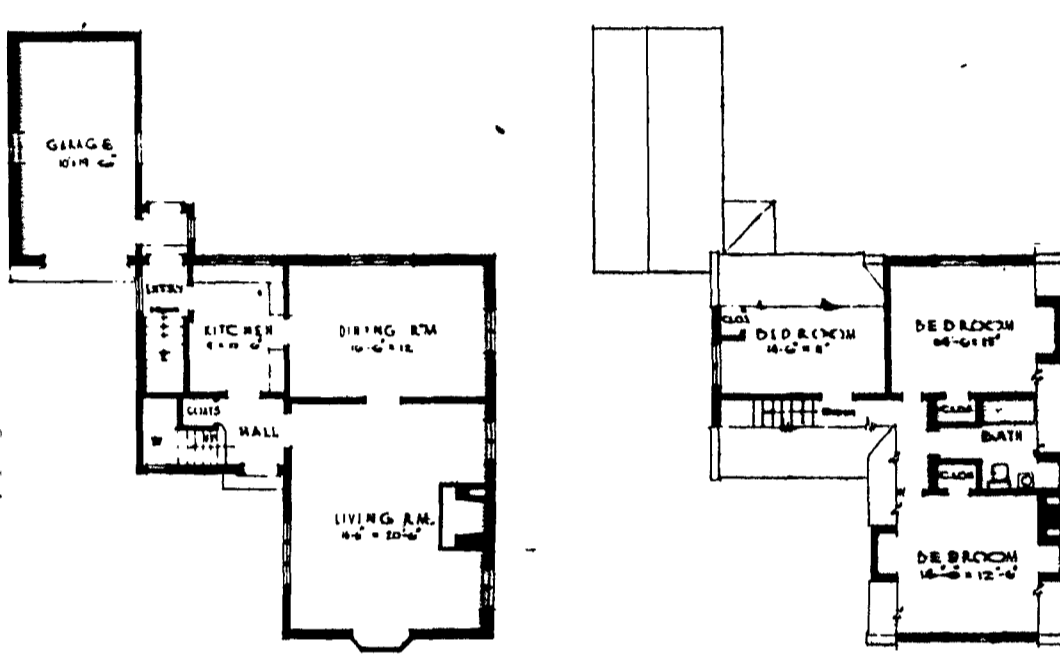
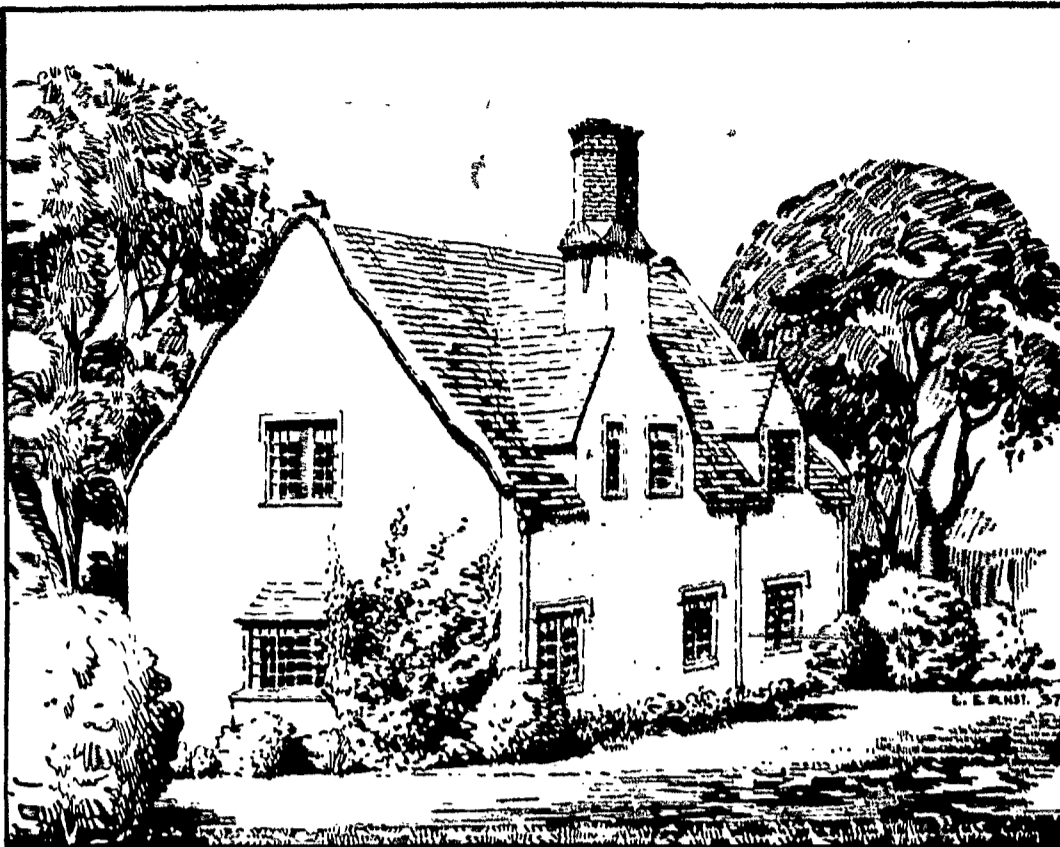

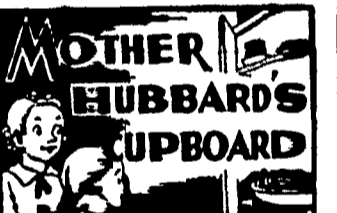

The earnings of great numbers of agricultural wage hands are much the same. A recent study of the Division of Social Research of the Works Progress Administration showed that the average net income of wage hands, sharecroppers and other tenants in 1934 in 11 areas of the South was \$20 per family, or \$7.2 per person. Her petition will go to the Committee of Privileges in the House of Lords.

RESCUE LIFELINE... Ouellet, N. Y.—Three hundred papers have been safely transported 100 miles from their temporary quarters in the cantonment at Suifu, South China, to the new City of Heaven Laper-Ayung at Nhat Moon, conducted by the Maryknoll Fathers. The journey, made at night to lessen the danger of the malarial fever which is rampant in the area, almost ended disastrously, according to Father Joseph Sweeney, M.M., of New Britain, Conn., when two of the junkies at-
