NUN TELLS HOW MOTHER CABRINI'S INTERCESSION BROUGHT MIRACULOUS CURE

SEATTLE SISTER DESCRIBES VISION OF FOUNDESS AND HER RECOVERY

SEATTLE (NC) — Her own account of the miracle performed through intercession of Mother Francis Xavier Cabrini and by which she was restored to health after emigration from the medical profession has been given here by Sister Delina Graziosi, who is in charge of the nurses' home at Columbia hospital.

"We are all so happy," Sister Delina said, "and of course it is of special joy to me. We pray to Mother Cabrini every day and many times during the day. It was in 1914 when I came to the United States. I met her in New York and when I was sent to Seattle in 1916, Mother Cabrini was here to open Columbia Hospital. When I asked about the vision that preceded her cure, Sister Delina eagerly told of the great happiness which had been hers.

"I was suffering from a serious stomach ailment," she said, "and the best medical aid was given me and four major operations were performed in the hope that I might be cured or, at least, relieved from the terrible pain I was suffering. My condition did not improve, physicians despairing of my case and I was sent to Sacred Heart Orphanage here to spend my last days.

"It was in March, 1925, that I went to the orphanage. I was unable to do any work. At the end of July of the same year I went to bed prepared to die. I could take no food and even the little weak tea which the Sisters gave me could not be retained. The pain grew steadily worse until I thought I could not bear it.

"On the night of December 14 I saw Mother Cabrini standing by my bed. She looked at me and said: 'I am going to send you with Mother Carmela to work.' 'That is impossible,' I said to myself. 'I am so weak.' 'When the Sisters came into my room the following day I was so weak I could not tell them what I had seen and heard. This continued a hour.

Documents on Prisoners Revealing Orders To 'Blow-up Everything' Widespread Destruction of Cities

BILBAO—In Nules and Barriana, recently liberated by Nationalist troops on the march toward Valencia, the Reds blow up the churches with dynamite before retreating. At Villarreal the finest church was burned and with it the body of St. Pascual Balleu, declared by Pope Leo XIII the Patron of Eucharistic workers and associations. An order to "blow-up everything" was found.

This information was obtained by the writer from four eye-witnesses to the events in Nules and Barriana. The information further was confirmed by correspondents of secular newspapers of London, Madrid, Paris and it appears also in official reports.

To save the lives of civilians and to avoid destruction of property, the Gallic battalions made an easy approach to Nules. A bomb was dropped, but it was there an artillery barrage. The city was taken easily. But these humanitarian precautions were useless. Only in certain districts, however, there had been such systematic destruction.

The destruction of Nules cannot be laid at the door of Franco's armies. The city was destroyed by order of the Red military command and there is proof of this. As the soldiers of Gallic approached the city and their entrance was easy, whether the city was defended or abandoned, the Red soldiers within the city began their work.

Only a small church, which had been used as a school, remained, but its towers were cracked by the explosions. The mansions of the wealthy, the modest homes of the poor, public buildings, all were leveled to the ground. The street was mountainous with debris and the Red soldiers moved cautiously when they entered because of the menace of falling walls.
