Lauds Card. Innitzer's Anschluss Stand

NOTRE DAME, IND.—Contrary to what some people like to contend, His Eminence Theodore Cardinal Innitzer, Archbishop of Vienna, did not "let down" Austria and the Church in the German-Austrian Anschluss, but actually made the best of a bad situation. Manuel Colayo, Editor of the Commonwealth, Philippine Catholic publication, and one of the leaders of Catholic Action in the Philippine Islands, declared in an address at the University of Notre Dame, this week.

In a second lecture, Mr. Colayo told of a resurgence of Catholicism in the Philippines today.
