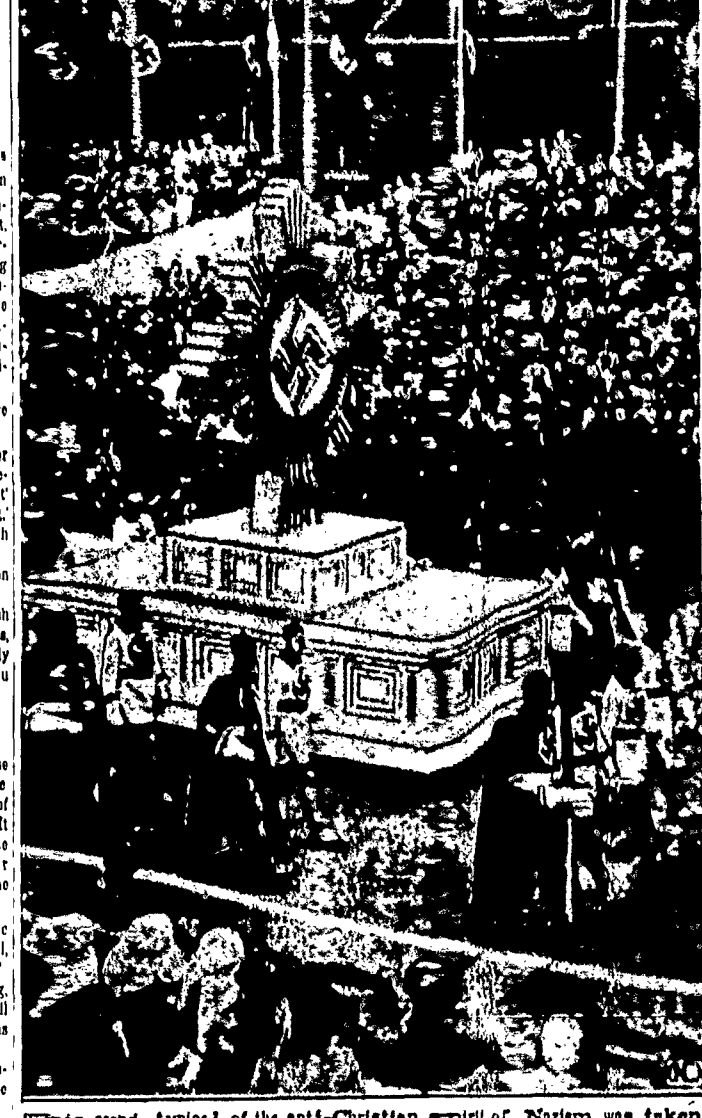

Powder Blast Kills Priest in China

PEKING (N. C.)—The Rev. Dominic Baldieri, 25-year-old Franciscan of the Sianfu Vicariate in Shensi, died in consequence of being received in a powder explosion, according to reports just received here by Lumen Service. Father Baldieri was stationed in a mountainous district where there are many marauders and where the villagers had laid in a supply of powder for emergency use. The magazine exploded accidentally, seriously wounding Father Baldieri who happened to be nearby.
