3 CANADA BISHOPS

Attend Meeting of Society of Artisans

MONTEREAL, (N. C.)—"Subversive doctrines live on the misery hunger of the people, and in this sea of suffering, islands of appeasement such as your society are needed," the Most Rev. Alphonse Deschamps, Auxiliary Bishop of Montreal, told a large gathering of the French Canadian Artisans Society, at the observance of their patronal feast.

The Most Rev. Arthur Puineau, Bishop of Joliette, celebrated the pontifical Mass, and at a later gathering Bishop Deschamps, Bishop Puineau, and the Most Rev. Alfred Langlois, Bishop of Valleyfield, spoke.

"Why should there be tolerated in this province of Quebec the circulation of ideas subversive of order and against the happiness of our homes?" Bishop Deschamps asked. "It is time to see capable men rise up to defend our religious patrimony. Do not let it be trampled on. It is too precious.

"If we want to prevent misery, which is an evil counselor, fight against misery, peace out, in our own hearts will be assured," he added.

"French courage to our young people," urged Bishop Puineau. "They have great need of it. Preach courage and energy. They are needed, and in so doing your society will be more than an insurance company."

LISTS ATTRACTIONS

Six days and six nights of entertainment will begin at Edgerton Park Labor Day with the opening of the Monroe County Fair, Rochester Exposition and Live Stock Show.

In front of the grandstand each afternoon and evening Naida Roberts will present her animal circus. The Peppers Circus will perform 45 feet above the ground, and J. H. Waterman will exhibit his trained eel in a leetering board act and a tug-of-war. The arena program will close each evening with display of fireworks.

All seats in the mammoth grandstand will be free.

The 54th Regiment Band will play concerts each afternoon and evening. Stue Hastings Harmonica, one of the most popular attractions of the last two years, will return for four shows each afternoon and evening in the Industrial Building.

Orphans from city homes will be entertained by the fair exposition management on Tuesday, Children's Day Wednesday will be Grand and Farm Bureau Day. Late next Governor M. William Bray will make an official visit to the fair on Thursday, Governor's Day.

Special attractions in front of the grandstand later in the week will be the school band demonstrations Friday afternoon and the volunteer firemen's tournament Saturday afternoon.

Live stock entries are in excess of past years. Boys and Girls of the 4-H Clubs of Monroe County will exhibit calves lambs, poultry, farm produce clothing and food in the Flower Show displays will be made by garden clubs, arbor gardeners and growers.

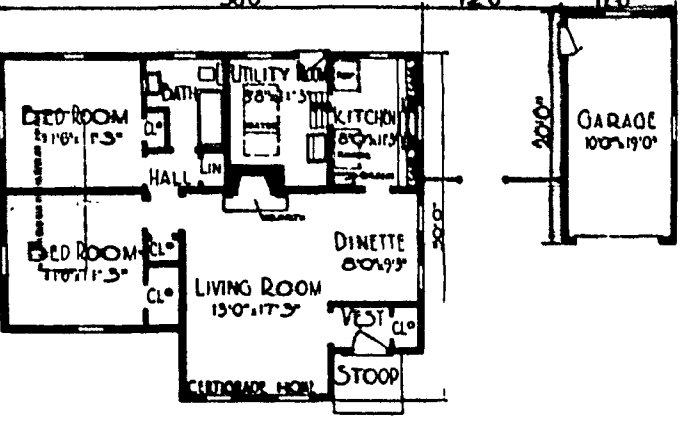

Pope Rebukes Italian Press

For Criticisms

VATICAN CITY (N. C.)—Excerpts from the Italian press that have made bold to criticize His Holiness Pope Pius XI drew a rebuke from the Holy Father on August 31.

These papers had asserted that "Catholic Action was really a political rather than a religious association and they warned the Sovereign Pontiff not to confuse Catholic Action with the Catholic Church."

Anti-Religionists

Draw Surveillance Of Police

NEW ORLEANS (N. C.)—New Orleans Police Department has announced that it will detain persons who sell anti-religious and seditious matter in New Orleans homes or who play anti-religious phonograph records in the houses. The charges will be "soliciting without a permit" and "disturbing the peace of the city."

Carrying about a phonograph, anti-religionists not content with distributing literature, gain admittance into homes on the plea of having something of interest to the residents, and put on a record against the religions of Catholics, Protestants and Jews. When unable to play the records in a house they play them outside. This practice is carried on in the country as well as in the city.

RETREATANTS TELL OF

BENEFITS DERIVED

SAN FRANCISCO (N. C.)—A young man and young woman described their experiences as retreatants over the radio in the weekly program sponsored by "The Monitor" arch-diocesan Catholic weekly here.

The subject of the broadcast was retreats in view of the current annual retreats of priests throughout the country. After an explanation of the meaning of retreats, John Doyle and Miss Dorothy Walsh were called upon to give their views concerning retreats.

Describing retreats he has made at El Retiro, Los Altos, Mr. Doyle declared in answer to one question that after a retreat he felt he had been given "an opportunity to become better acquainted with the help of God gained by the prayer and meditation of the previous days," he said he found it easier to lead a good life and a happy one.

Miss Walsh told of the week-end retreats conducted by the Maryknoll Sisters at Mountainview, Calif.

Manager of 'Daily Tribune' Is Dead

DUBUQUE—Herbert S. Mann, General Manager of the Daily Tribune, Catholic daily newspaper published here, died unexpectedly last night at the age of 63. His death was due to a heart attack.

A native of Mayville, Wis., Mr. Mann had but recently taken over the direction of the Daily Tribune. He was widely known in the secular newspaper field, being a member of the Inland Daily Press Association and for several years president of the Wisconsin Daily Newspaper League. He formerly was vice-president and treasurer of the Journal Printing Company, publisher of the Racine (Wis.) Journal-Times.

POPE REBUKES

THOSE WHO SAY

Catholic Action

is Meddling

VATICAN CITY—(N. C. Radio)—His Holiness Pope Pius XI spoke twice with relation to Catholic Action in audiences on Saturday. The first time the Holy Father rebuked those who accuse Catholic Action of meddling in things that are not its concern. The second time he expressed confidence that the aid hours recently faced by Catholic Action in Italy now are definitely passed.

Addressing forty pilgrims, members of Catholic Action of the Archdiocese of Rheims, Pope Pius noted that Catholic Action is the subject of considerable comment in the press of the world, and declared that often the things said about Catholic Action are incorrect.

"This is true also of the French press," His Holiness said.

It is wrong to accuse Catholic Action of meddling in questions that do not concern it and to cite as an example the Sovereign Pontiff declared.

Further, His Holiness pointed out, is a wide and inappropriate expression that embraces something so human that it cannot be considered extraneous to philosophy, morals and religion. Faith teaches what is to be believed on this subject, the Holy Father added.

Speaking to a group of pilgrims from Bergamo, Italy, Pope Pius recalled recent difficulties experienced by local Catholic Action groups, and expressed confidence that these aid hours have passed, in view of the promises to this country, and those everywhere, which the Catholic Action kept within the limits agreed upon; namely, religious life, and he must say that he has been obeyed and supported in this, His Holiness declared.

Some 60 pilgrims from Bavaria were given a specially cordial welcome by the Holy Father on Saturday. Telling the group that he was happy to welcome them in these times so threatening and troublesome for them, Pope Pius assured the German pilgrims that he prays constantly for their country, and does everything possible for it. He charged the pilgrims to convey his fullest blessing to His Eminence Michael Cardinal von Faulhaber, Archbishop of Munich.

ROBERT BRENNAN IS IRELAND'S MINISTER TO U. S.

WASHINGTON, (N. C.)—Robert Brennan last night was named Minister of Ireland to the United States.

Mr. Brennan, who has been Charge d'Affaires since the departure some months ago of former Minister Michael MacWhite, who now represents his Government in Italy, came to the Irish Legation here in 1934 as its secretary. He previously had been manager of the Irish Press in Dublin. He was prominent in the rising of 1916, and was one of those who led a 1920 rebellion, but escaped to the United States. A native of Westport, County Wick, Ireland, Mr. Brennan has worked as a teacher, a civil engineer and a newspaperman. He resigned the position of Secretary of Foreign Affairs to organize the Irish Press.
