BARE EFFORT TO COERCE U. S. Workers To Aid Spanish Leftists

WASHINGTON (N. C.)—A bold attempt to coerce Federal employees to contribute to relief for Leftist Spain being collected by the North American Committee to Aid Spanish Democracy was brought to light here this week.

Not only were these United States workers told in the most urgent terms they should contribute; the names of Government officials, their "bosses," were signed to the call. The employees were put in the position of paying or courting the displeasure of those under whom they work.

In fact, the whole matter was brought out when troubled workers, unwilling to lend financial aid to the rascals of Spain, but fearful about their jobs, went to friends for counsel. Even if resistance to the coercion did not result in loss of employment, they foresaw a loss of standing with their superiors, making their jobs unpleasant.

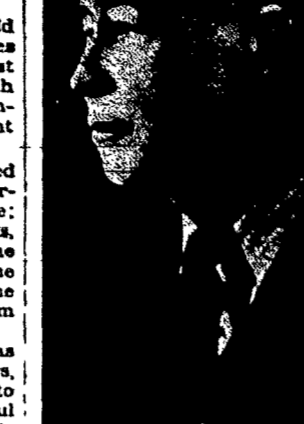
