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All so frequently we hear it said that the Church is the enemy of science. The old school teachers are regarded in support of such a view. Galileo and Roger Bacon the Spanish Inquisition and so on are quoted and related to prove the Church as the one obstacle in the path of scientific advance.

The Mission Intention selected by the Holy Father personally should at least prove the position of the Church in science. She has ever kept abreast of progress and has used the discoveries of scientists to her advantage. Now with new inventions unimagined a few years ago, the world has been more closely knit together. Europe has been transplanted into America's backyard (China and Japan, the whole Orient in fact) like with us in our living rooms. The past few days have amply testified to the speed at which news travels. Seventeen minutes after the close of the famous meeting in Munich the decision was made its way around the world.

Thus we see the timeliness of the Pontiff's intention. That the Catholic Church in spreading her teaching may find ready to hand the various instruments of mass publicity.

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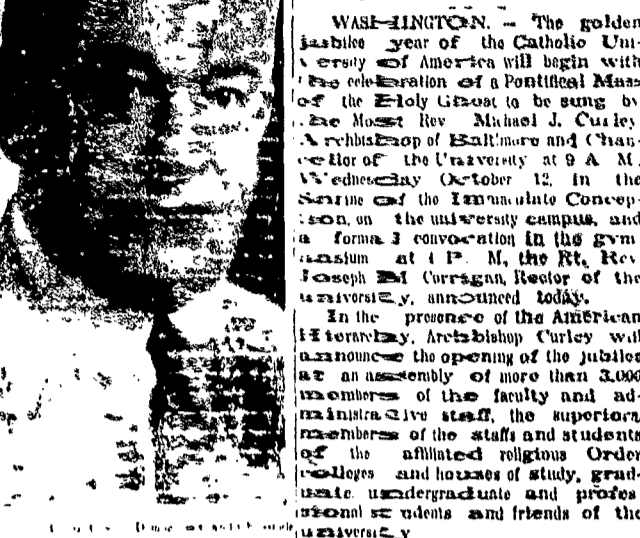
