Talks on Rosary Over NBC Hook-up

WASHINGTON, Oct. 13.—A series of three addresses on the Rosary to be delivered by one of America's prominent preachers, against a background of prayer recited by the Speech Choir of Rosary College, River Forest, Ill., will be rounded out with Sacred Music by a distinguished choir society, is scheduled to open in the nation-wide "Catholic Hour" on October 16, according to an announcement made here today at the offices of the National Council of Catholic Men.
