Martyr Bishop Held Model For Socialists

BISHOP HUNT AT DIOCESAN RALLY Plays Totalitarian State, Divorce

"We can model our lives after the life of our Lord for the faith for which he died and if necessary, we too, can die for it."

With these words, His Excellency, the Most Rev. Dominick G. Hunt, Bishop of Salt Lake City, in his sermon at the diocesan rally of Rochester, set up a model for every member of the Society of Our Lady at the opening of the Diocesan Rally Sunday in Columbus Civic Center Auditorium.

At the opening of the Mass, offerings of bread and wine were brought down the center aisle to the altar by a group of Sodality Union leaders.

Bishop Hunt, in speaking of St. John Fisher, Martyr Bishop of Rochester, recalled some early history of the Church and the world and explained how the evils of divorce and the totalitarian state arose.

He called for stronger opposition to both divorce and trends toward the totalitarian state.

At the conclusion of the Mass, Bishop Kearney expressed appreciation to all who had contributed to the impressive ceremony of the morning.

Father Lord called the reactions of Americans to affairs across the sea as being either one of "wonder" or one of "amusement."
