NOTRE DAME, IND.—An Indian chief and a French aristocrat will share honors with the late Knute Rockne in the fieldhouse being erected as a memorial to the famous coach at the University of Notre Dame.

Six other plaques will be impressed in the structure. Over the south entrance will be the shield of the University of Notre Dame and over the north entrance the shield of the United States.
