MANUEL GERANA BURGOS (NC). - The teaching Religious are well satisfied with the new Secondary Education Law of Nationalist Spain which place private schools on a in with pubile schools and requires the same standards for both classes of schools, all of which are under the annerwision of the Minister of Edu cation and the State Inspector's

No child in Nationalist Spain will be deprived of an opport unity to obtain an education, for even private schools will be required to accopt a certain percentage of non-

The spirit of the new education law is to develop citizens with a technique that takes into consideration religious, patriotic and hu-manistic tenets. The pupils of public and private schools will enjoy the same rights for equivalent work, but private schools may establish fees or honorariusms with

in their own regimen.

Religion and philosophy are the fundamentals of the education established by the new law. The seven-year course will include th. of the Catholic Religion morals, the Gospela liturgy. Chaurch History and Apologetics, with sup-plementary courses in physics-ophy during the last three years.

Elemental Studies The first courses, three in mumber, will constitute a cycle of ele-mental studies after which subjects will be to a cortain extent elective according to the particular career which the pupil expects to follow Upon the completion of the seven courses of study, pupils of both private and public schools will have to pass the same exargination entry into the universities. These examinations will be conducted by special tribuncals appointed by the universities.

Every pupil will have to present is "Book of Scholarly Qualifica-on" which will constitute a" academaic history of the pumil from the time he enters the secondary school until his graduation. These books are being issued by the Min-latry of National Education and the entries will have to check with official documents of the respective schools. 
