COMMUNIST DEFEATED

FACULTY OF THEOLOGY
Riga.—The Faculty of Theology instituted as part of the State University of Riga by common accord following the signing of additional Conventions between the Holy See and Latvia, inaugurated its first academic year with solemn ceremonies.

Among those present at the ceremonies were the Latvian Minister to the Holy See, the Charge d'Affaires of the Holy See at Riga, the Latvian Minister of Education, the Rector of the University and the Most Rev. Boleslas Skloskan, Apostolic Administrator of Minsk.

RELIGIOUS TRAINING NEEDED
Chicago, Ill.—The necessity for religious education at school was stressed at a meeting here by the Rev. Dr. Robert Paton, United Church Minister.

"Christian education has to be concerned in sowing seeds of religious education in the child to develop a sense of God," he declared.

Anything done in a half hour on Sunday for 82 Sundays a year in teaching children to know the sense of God is killed by secular education, six hours a day, five days a week, 10 months a year, Dr. Paton said.

NEW SYSTEM WANTED
Regina, Sask.—A memorandum asking that an Educational Council comprising the Hierarchy as well as members with lay members to be named by the government be set up to look after the Catholic schools has been submitted to the commission headed by Mr. Justice Martin, which is inquiring into the teaching system in Saskatchewan.

The Rev. Maurice Baudoux, Secretary of the Franco-Canadian Catholic Association of Saskatchewan, submitted the memorandum. Rights of Catholics to set up their own schools are emphasized.

PEACE IN JERUSALEM
Jerusalem.—Some Zionists are proposing the establishment of an autonomous Judeo-Arab Palestine within a Semitic Federal Union.

Advocates of such a plan to solve the Holy Land problem stress that Arab is neither Jewish nor Semitic. They point out that the question of minorities within Palestine becomes utterly meaningless when viewed in relation to the vast territory controlled by the Arabs outside Palestine.

DIVINE GUIDANCE For Pan-American Congress Asked

LIMA (NC).—The guidance of God, faith in Whom tempered the souls of the conquistadores and civilized the native spirit, in whose name liberty was proclaimed and Who presides over the destiny of the world, was invoked by President Oscar R. Benavides of Peru in opening the eighth Pan-American Congress Friday in the presence of delegates of 23 nations of the Western World.

LIMA (NC).—Exaggerated nationalism may run amok and destroy the peace of the whole world, the Very Rev. John F. O'Hara, (S.S.C. President of the University of Notre Dame and member of the American delegation to the Pan-American Congress, declared in a sermon delivered in the Cathedral here Thursday the Feast of the Immaculate Conception.

Father O'Hara warned against the danger of nationalism, that the physical proximity of the American republics assures peace, declaring that this situation usually had meant war.

"Stepped in the blessing of self-government he said, 'it is easy for us to forget loyalty, to take for granted the blessings for which our forefathers shed their blood. Every nation tinker with a subversive doctrine, be it light pink or deep red, will produce a monster who would do us to a sense of false security and who would disarm us in the presence of an armed foe, is disloyal to the common interest upon which Americans are founded on the blessing of democratic government."

MEXICANS AROUSED By Brutal Murder Of Catholic Pastor

MEXICO CITY (NC).—The beloved 15-year-old pastor of the Church of San Juan de Dios, Guadalajara, the Rev. Miguel Diaz Orozco, was murdered for the money he had received among the faithful for repairs to his church.

It is suspected that his murderer, or murderers, came from the workers employed to make these repairs. The brutal manner in which he was killed with a hammer and chisel—attestates this suspicion.

The indignation of Catholics has assumed a grave character and they are demanding of the highest authorities that they take steps to prevent such crimes which are becoming more and more frequent. Thousands have viewed the body of Father Diaz Orozco and a crowd attended the funeral.

The parish church at Cerezo in the State of Hidalgo, has been burglarized. The stones from the crown of the image of the Blessed Virgin, donations, poor boxes and most of the church vestments and ornaments were stolen.

FORMER PRESIDENT OF MEXICO SCORES Tyranny Of Stalin, Russian Conditions



MEXICO CITY.—Humanity has not made any advance through this experiment in Communism in Soviet Russia, General Abelardo L. Rodriguez, former President of Mexico, declares in a series of articles published in El Universal under the title "Notes on My Visit to Russia."

Communism has collapsed and Communism and Socialism in Russia only theories remain, he says. Italian Communism, he writes, brought about Fascism; Communism in Germany brought Nazism; in Spain it resulted in destruction and shedding of the blood of the innocent and in France it has caused confusion. The Communism of Lenin and Trotsky in Russia, he writes, has been transformed into a complete denial of their theories.

Humanity, the former President says, is wounded and bleeding from such an experiment in social evolution. Democracy, he declares, will be its salvation.

Asserting that he embarked upon his Russian trip with an open mind and without any preconceived opinion to observe and analyze, he writes that the Russian envoy in London told him he would find in the Soviet Union the "solid foundations of a political organization on the way, with the framework or walls already finished, lacking only the roof painting and final touches to complete it."

Oppressed Humanity
What he found, he writes, was "a strictly Stalinist structure fabricated of the same oppressed human material utilized in past ages by Russian tyranny to keep itself in power." Plans of the Revolution of 1917, he asserts, were not followed but had been wiped out by Stalin, who "with the pervasive explosive imagination of the dictator" is rebuilding on ruins trickling in conformity with his personal ambitions.

Following the general elements of the Communist tyrants, General Rodriguez writes, "the (Stalin) has been able to establish his regime of oppression and servitude although with certain attenuations and prerogatives."

The despotic regime of Stalin feeds a servile people better than in order to exploit it the better the people, he writes, the more they broke the shackles of servitude Stalin has again bound the nation but with gilded and anointed shackles, more refined but undoubtedly more difficult to break.

After reviewing the history of Russia under the Czars, General Rodriguez says Stalin found propitious material in that it was easy to take and give away the things established by the Bolshevik Party "in a people who have never known liberty." The Communist doctrine of Marx, Engels, Lenin and Trotsky he believes, he remarks, is the least of the evils. While the Roman used wild pluckings, Germany were already at the plough.

London Paper Uncovers Secret Nazi Document Attacking the Catholic Church

TERMED 'VICIOUS ANTI-CHRISTIAN' Statement By Secular Newspaper

LONDON (NC).—A secret document issued to teachers of the Hitler Youth Movement has been discovered and disclosed by the Daily Mirror London paper.

Reference to the document in the Observer Roman, Va. can daily, sent the Daily Mirror in search of it. In printing the document, the paper describes it as "the most vicious anti-Christian statement ever written."

Reference to the matter was made in the Universe, Catholic weekly here, in a special story from Vienna, which quoted one clause, "We die, but goodness remains. Therefore the Catholic Church must perish."

The Mirror states that this Nazi statement has never been published and that it was issued as a private document which teachers were not supposed to show their friends. This is the text: "Of the philosophical teaching of the Hitler youth in Austria."

"Christianity is a religion for slaves and fools, for the last shall be first and the first shall be last. Blessed is the poor in spirit."

"Christianity is the same as Communism."

"Christianity regards Negroes and Germans as equals."

"The New Testament is a Jewish swindle on the part of four Evangelists because the teaching is copied exactly from the Indian belief of Jesus Christ."

"The Church is an international organization which works with violence and terror. Where it is loved one is a traitor and one's enemy."

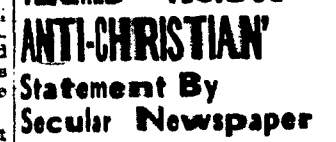

FR. WALKER DIES At Elmira, Rites Monday, Dec. 19

Rev. Francis B. Walker, Chaplain at St. Joseph's Hospital, Elmira, died Thursday, Dec. 15. He had been ill for some time but had been on active duty up until the last few weeks.

Funeral services are to be conducted Monday morning at ten o'clock at the Chapel of St. Joseph's Hospital, Elmira. The Most Rev. James F. McEvoy, Bishop of Rochester, will celebrate a Solemn Pontifical High Mass. The Rev. Fr. Magr. Victor F. Lee of Geneva will deliver the sermon. Burial will be in St. Joseph's Cemetery.

Father Walker was born Jan. 20, 1883 at Corning, N. Y. He took his preparatory work at St. Andrew's Seminary and his Theological studies at St. Bernard's. He was ordained on June 12, 1911.

He was pastor at St. Theresa's in Stanley for a short time and in 1928 was made pastor of St. Joseph's Church in Woodport. Because of ill health he resigned at Woodport and was made Chaplain at St. Joseph's Hospital, Elmira, N. Y., in June, 1934.

Burial will be made in the crypts at St. Mary's, Elmira, N. Y., on Monday, Dec. 19.

JACK SPALDING, NOTED GEORGIA LAYMAN, DEAD

MIAMI.—Jack Spalding of Atlanta, a former president of the Catholic Laymen's Association of Georgia and a prominent attorney died last Thursday following a brief illness. He was 82 years of age.

Mr. Spalding, who was nationally known for activities as a Catholic layman, was twice highly honored by His Holiness Pope Pius XI. He was named a Knight of St. Gregory the Great and a Knight of Malta. Notre Dame University bestowed upon him its Laetere Medal.

The funeral will be held Monday at the funeral home of Mr. Spalding, King, now being completed in Atlanta, the Most Rev. Gerald P. O'Hara, Bishop of Savannah-Atlanta, officiating at the Pontifical Mass of Requiem. It will be the first service in the new church and in the erection of which Mr. Spalding had been a most generous factor.

In 1928, the University of Notre Dame conferred the Laetere Medal on Mr. Spalding for his religious and civic achievements.

NAZI VIOLENCE PLAYED BY FR. CLEARY AT PROTEST MEETING

"The Catholic Church opposes and will always oppose dictatorships, whether those of Communism, Nazism, Fascism or Unbridled Capitalism." Such was the declaration of the Rev. Donald M. Cleary, Catholic Chaplain of Cornell University, at the assembly in Willard Straight Hall last Sunday.

More than 500 people were present to hear united protest against the "inhuman persecutions" now taking place in Germany as voiced by the Rev. A. H. Bantwell of Elmira at the assembly in Willard Straight Hall last Sunday.

After several such outbursts, the only response which these holding responsible positions would make was, "That is an affair belonging to the individual person—not a national problem."

Several years ago I was attached to one of our State prisons in the capacity of a Catholic Chaplain. During those years, in various sections of the country, there took place what the Press called "Hoax." They were in fact, an attempt on the part of the inmate population of these institutions to bring to the attention of the public the situation.

For the past twenty-five years, the persecution of minorities in various nations has taken place. First, Russia, with its "liquidation" of its landed class and its religious class, resulting in the death of millions of people, followed, and as a result, the forms which have now been effected were set in motion. I see in the present persecution of a helpless minority in Germany, an analogous situation.

Next came Spain, and once again the land ran red with the blood of those whose lives were sacrificed because they refused to materialize their heritage before these individual cases, representations were made to those in high places asking that something be done to protect these persecuted minorities. They were told that these things were the concern only of the nation in which they were happening, that they were purely internal affairs. Now, however, we see that the consciences of those who direct the destinies of free people have been awakened to the fact that these persecutions are not merely the concern of individual nations, but directly concern the future of every nation.

I need not recount for you the recent happenings in Germany; you are as familiar with them as I, and yet, it seems incredible as we read our daily papers that these things can be happening in what we have liked to call "Our Civilized Generation."
