Baptist Diocese in Russia Is Dissolved

MOSCOW—A Baptist diocese created in 1937, with a makeshift named Serzh at its head and with 2,400 members in 69 parishes, has been dissolved by the OGPU and its properties confiscated. The action followed collisions with Communist youth groups.

Serzh and other leaders were arrested and charged with "counter-revolution."

He has been sentenced to death and the others to terms from three to ten years of penal servitude.
