Facts and News about YOUR NATIONAL CATHOLIC UNIVERSITY

THE LAW SCHOOL. One of the most interesting aspects of the Catholic University of America beginning the second half century of its existence, is the new program of the Law School. With the approval of the Board of Right Reverend Monsignor Joseph M. Corrigan, and the Board of Trustees, at the time of the appointment of a new Dean the program policy was announced for the future progress of the Law School.

This was stated as follows: "We are determined to achieve the highest possible scholarship standards, limit our student body to a few hundred full-time students, and provide a limited number of local and national scholarships to college graduates of outstanding ability and character."

In pursuance of such a policy significant changes are already apparent in the program and work of the school. Scholastic standards have been raised and the school is now one of a select group of eight law schools in the United States which require a baccalaureate degree of every candidate for admission. The faculty has been strengthened by the addition of several professors of outstanding scholastic and teaching accomplishments.

Among the new appointments is Mr. M. Quinn Sullivan, from Harvard Law School, where he was a member of the Harvard Law Review and a member of the Board of Student Activities. He has had extensive experience in government service as Assistant General Counsel of the Securities and Exchange Commission. Other new members are Dr. Thomas C. Billig, formerly Professor of Law at Duke University and West Virginia University; Mr. James P. Ryan, a former faculty member of the University of Iowa Law School; and Francis Walker, an outstanding graduate of the Yale Law School.

The faculty committee on curriculum, after a thorough study of the curriculum of several leading law schools, has recommended the introduction of a more advanced course in Procedure and Judicial Administration. Consistently with the distinctly Catholic objectives of the school, a series of lectures has been introduced on the Meaning and Function of Law in Society and The Church

and its Function in Law, by Rev. Edward Roiter, J.C.D., of the faculty of the School of Canon Law. Additional courses in Jurisprudence afford an exceptional and unique opportunity for the intellectual development of students. Integrating elements of such allied fields as Legal History, Philosophy, and Theology, Roman and Canon Law, Sociology, and Economics, these courses represent a new departure in the Catholic law schools of this country in attempting to build a distinctively Catholic conception of juristic thought capable of competing with the utilitarian jural theories of America's outstanding non-Catholic schools of law.

Probably the most interesting innovation has been the new system of law clubs formed by the students in an equally balanced group of counsel who prepare appellate briefs and argue cases before notable leaders of the bar and judiciary of Washington. The object is to offer students an opportunity to prepare briefs and arguments upon actual pleadings of cases which are on the docket of the United States Circuit Court of Appeals and the United States Supreme Court. This allows the student a realistic comparison of his own work with the briefs and court arguments of lawyers in notable cases which the student later attends. Able law club guidance in legal research and brief drafting has been given by a group of attorney advisers chosen from alumni and friends of the Law School.

The school has extended the graduate law curriculum with particular reference to recent and important developments in American law in such fields as Administrative Law, Labor Law, Securities and Exchange Commission and Taxation. The attendance has increased largely, both in respect to students pursuing courses for advanced law degrees and in respect to practitioners who are enabled by these courses to keep abreast of changes and progress in important fields of legislation. A still wider group of subjects is being offered, including a course on the new Federal court rules and procedure.

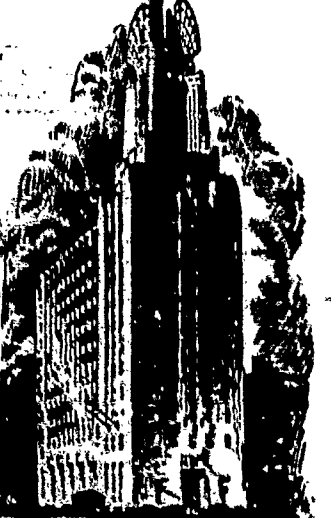
