of his Pontificate. The Monsignor came from Milan with Pope Pius following his election to the Papacy, and, as his private secretary, were constantly at his side. All Vatican edifices brought the Papal flag to half-mast, and the bells of St. Peter's Basilica were solemnly tolled. St. Peter's Square in front of the Vatican was kept clear to permit the Cardinals, diplomats and other dignitaries to enter and leave the Vatican without hindrance.

## Schines Take Lead In Neighborhood Movie Theaters

With the sale of four neighborhood theaters to the Schines chain for an estimated half million dollars, Albert A. Fenway, 43-year-old pioneer theater builder and operator has terminated nearly 50 years in the motion picture business.

Sale of the theaters—the West End, Madison, Morris and Liberty—gives the Schines interests 10 community moving picture houses, largest single group in city. Although out of the operation phase of the business, the Fenway Park Theater Corporation, organized by the senior Fenway and now headed by a son, Albert O. Fenway, still has an interest in the Rochester Theater Building and owns the Capitol Theater Building and the Little Theater, which is operated by Mrs. Florence Bellison, daughter of the senior Fenway.

Under the sale contract, the Schines interests, known as the Munnad Park Theater Corporation, assumes first and second mortgages on the four theaters, totaling more than \$200,000 and a purchase money mortgage of \$100,000 payable to the seller in 15 years at 8 per cent interest. Cash payment in the deal was \$50,000, it was said.

Previous to the sale the Schines corporation had the Liberty Theater under lease and owned and operated the Riviera, Dixie, State, Erie, Canal and Grand theaters. The present setup, it was pointed out, will give the Schines houses here choice of all pictures following their initial showing in downtown theaters. Actual operation of the new-owners was effective last Friday night.

## THE POPE OF THE MISSIONS IS DEAD

The Pope is dead, Pius XI, who will rank with the great pontiffs of the Church, has passed to his eternal reward. His pontificate was marked by events of extraordinary importance in the political and religious world and all of them found him equal to the responsibilities of his high office. In every crisis which threatened, he emerged in the judgment of men, not merely a leader, but the leader of leaders. His voice was lifted to teach and direct his millions of followers and to inspire with Christian hope and idealism nations openly hostile or at variance with Rome.

In our work especially, he gave impetus to the present worldwide mission movement, inspiring its leaders and various activities with inspiration, insight and ability. Early in his pontificate, he consecrated native Chinese Bishops, for he was quick to see the nationalistic trend of so many sections of the world. By his advice and assistance he kept in constant touch with every phase of this part of the apostolate. He gave pontifical standing to The Society for the Propagation of the Faith, removing its headquarters from Paris to Rome. He also raised to the status of a pontifical society, The Society of St. Peter the Apostle for Native Clergy and the Holy Childhood Association.

Whatever critics may say of his stand in world politics, no one can contest his right to be hailed as the Pope of the Missions, whose constant concern was to spread the doctrine of true fraternity and charity. As Pope of the Missions, his daily thought was directed to the unnumbered millions still sitting in the darkness of paganism. Now his work is done. However, his soul, his far-sighted vision, his unswerving courage will prove an inspiration for the fulfillment of that Divine Command, "Go, teach all nations."

The Pope is dead, but the Church lives on. The apostolate of the missions must know no slackening but under the inspiration of the successor to Pius XI, it will go on to new triumphs bearing, unchanged and undimmed, to a troubled world, the teachings of Christ.

The Pope of the Missions is no more. The warrior for peace and righteousness has laid down the scepter of the dreadful responsibilities of his office. The missionaries in home and foreign missions join in prayer with the friends and benefactors of The Society for the Propagation of the Faith for the repose of his soul.
