The average giving the schools top position in their divisions was determined by dividing the total number of subscription points by the number of participating students. Participating students included all those in the school in the grades which took part in the Crusade.

The winning school in each of the seven Crusade divisions will be awarded an honor prize in the form of a Golden Jubilee Victory Banner in golden silk with blue lettering...
