Following is copy of a letter sent by the Rev. G. Stuart Hogan, pastor of St. James Church, Trumbull, to the Editors of Time Magazine, Chicago, Ill.

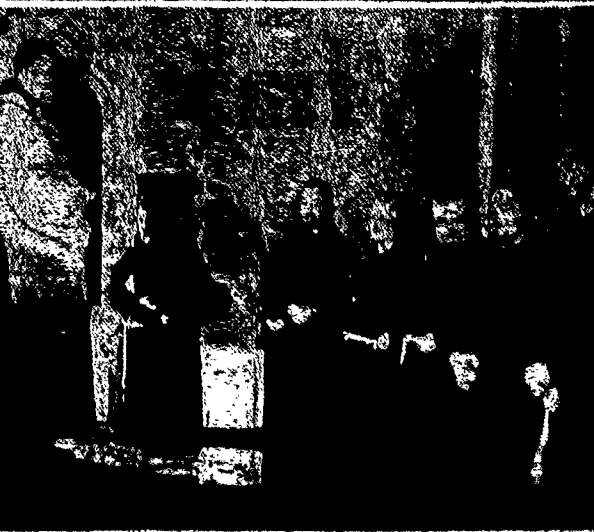
