CARDINAL MAGLIONE TAKES UP DUTIES As Papal Secretary Of State at Vatican

VATICAN CITY (N. C. Cable)—Named by His Holiness, Pope Pius XII as Cardinal Secretary of State, His Eminence Luigi Cardinal Maglione, former Papal Nuncio to France, has taken up the duties of his high office.
