PRESS GROUP AWARDS

Highest Honor To Mercy High Magazine

Medalist honors has been awarded to Mercedes, semi-annual magazine of Our Lady of Mercy High School, by the Columbia Scholastic Press Association according to Joseph M. Murphy, director of the organization. This is the highest honor any publication can receive. In the Columbia Clinic for judging magazines and newspapers, 1075 publications from forty-seven States, Alaska, West Indies and Hawaiian Islands were tested. Mercedes was the only magazine entered in Private School Group for girls to receive Medalist honors. The honor is not given every year only at a time when a magazine shows itself to be a piece of art. The winner of the medal must have earned more than 900 points from a possible 1,000 point score. The art work, advertising material, editorial message and general make-up must be the most outstanding in the group. Mercedes has won first place honors on four different occasions from the Columbia Press Association sponsored by the School of Journalism of Columbia University. Jane O'Brien is editor-in-chief of the prize winning issue.

Scholastic Society Honors Bishop

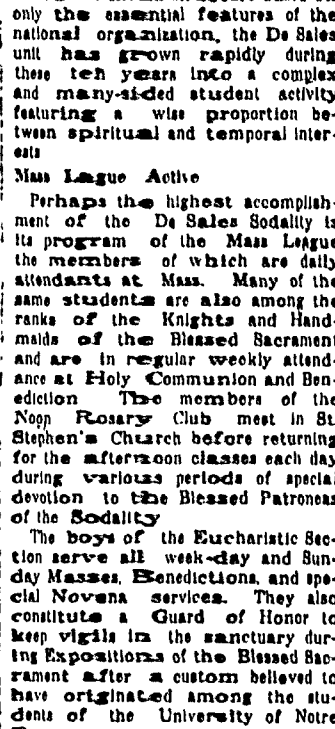
