

MISSION DONATIONS REACH NEW HIGH Rochester Makes

Large Contribution

NEW YORK. The Rt Rev. Magr Thomas J. McDonnell Na-tional Director of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith in the United States, reported the remilts of the activities of the or ganization for the year 1938 at the annual meeting of the National Board of Directors held here. At this meeting a complete resume of the work of the Society during the past year was given, togethe with a report of receipts, expenditures and disbursements as received from the 110 dioceses
The Society for the Propagation

of the Faith is a pontifical interna-tional organization devoted to helping Catholic missions throughout the world by prayers and monetary assistance of the faithful. The General Fund reported at Wednesday's meeting is made up of membersh:p-enrollments and donations from Catholics throughout the United States Increase Shown

The lotal of \$869,980.64 represents an increase of \$119.425.36 over the General Fund for 1937 and proves as Monsignor McDon-nell pointed out, "that the people of the United States are conscious of their duty toward the progress of the Church in other lands as well as in their own."

will be forwarded to the Supreme Council of the Society in Rome. from which place it will be distrib-uted among the 70,000 priests, brothers and sisters in the differ-
