## ESKIMOS RESCUE JESUIT FROM REDS

Fr. Hubbard To Tell How On Cornell Visit

How an American Jesuit missionary was saved by Eskimo hunters from arrest and imprisonment by Soviet officials when forced by a storm to land on an island off the coast of Siberia is related by Father Bernard R. Hubbard S.P., professor of Geology at Santa Clara University, Alaskan Explorer, better known as the "Glacier Priest," who brings his newest motion picture, "Cliff Dwellers of the Far North" to the Finger Lakes Region on April 12.

The Cornell Newman Club is responsible for the famous Jesuit explorer's visit with his eleven and latest Arctic expedition recorded in thrilling colored reels. He will appear in Bailey Hall on the Cornell Campus at Ithaca at 8:15 the Wednesday after Easter.

"Let American Communists spend two weeks in Siberia," he says. "Siberia is a land ruled by fear. It is a place where no one, native or white, dares express a personal opinion lest he be shot summarily. Eskimos Terrorized

"Siberian Eskimos are so terrorized—they are afraid to accept as much as a cigarette or a cup of coffee from an American."

Father Tom Cunningham, a Jesuit missionary stationed at Lester Diomedes Island in the Bering Strait (U. S. territory), Father Hubbard explains, was out with a party of Eskimo walrus hunters when forced by a storm to seek shelter in Russia's neighboring Greater Diomedes Island.

"Angry Soviet officials," says Father Hubbard, "menaced Father Cunningham with pistols and attempted to place him under arrest. Father Cunningham escaped seizure only because of the Eskimo hunters, headed by their chief, Uperalik, refused to permit it. They were fully prepared to die and quite capable of offering serious resistance, and the Soviet officials thought better of their plan."

This incident, Father Hubbard said, is typical of the attitude of the Russian Soviet officials, even toward the U. S. Coast Guard, when landing in Siberia with full authority to do so from Moscow and Washington.

"Cliff Dwellers of the Far North" is the pictorial record of the preparation for and consummation of a two-thousand mile journey in a heavily laden walrus skin boat across the Bering Sea and the stormy Arctic ocean. On this voyage Father Hubbard led the great bronze, "Christ of the Bering Sea" which faces across the sea toward Godless Siberia, a symbol of America's Christianity.
