Holy Name Union Plans Meet

SERVICE IN CHURCH TO OPEN CONVENTION

Niagara Professor To Address Delegates

Plans were put in motion this week for the annual Rochester Diocesan Holy Name Union Convention which will be opened by St. Basil's, the Most Rev. James H. Kearney in St. Ann's Church, Hornell on Sunday afternoon, April 23 at 2:30 o'clock.

His Excellency will officiate at Solemn Benediction after which the delegates from the various parishes of the diocese will assemble in one of the halls in Hornell for deliberations.

This year's speaker will be the Rev. Oswald E. Morton, M.A., professor of English and Director of the Pontifical Council at Niagara University. Father Morton spoke recently in Rochester on the Pope's Encyclical "Divini Redemptoris."

Promotion of Holy Name Society by Non-Catholic Canadian Army Officer

Among the great names of Canadian leaders in recent years none was surrounded with more honor or more popular appeal than that of the late Major General Sir James MacBrien.

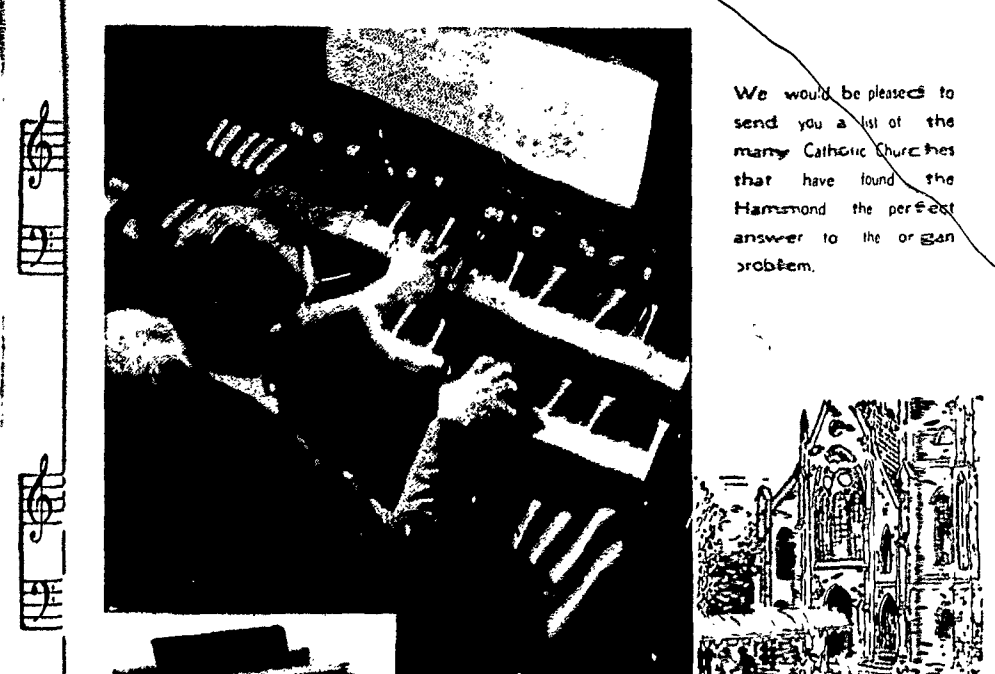
His death closed a colorful career—a rise from the ranks to Chief of Staff of the Canadian Mounted Police, which internationally famous force he had directed as a humble constable during the Great War he commanded the 12th Canadian Infantry Brigade.

General MacBrien also was a non-Catholic.

Major General D. Watson, commanding the 4th Canadian Division, headed "that every officer, N. C. O. and man in the Division will read and take to heart the contents of this leaflet." (He also was not a Catholic.)

Ex-President of the United States, Theodore Roosevelt, addressing a Holy Name rally at Oyster Bay, said:

"I am particularly glad to see such a society as this flourishing, as your society has flourished, because the future welfare of our nation depends upon the way in which we can combine in our march, our young men, decency and strength. I had the honor of this society as typifying one of those forces which tend to betterment and uplifting of our social system. Our whole effort should be towards securing a combination of the strong qualities which we term virtues in the breast of every good citizen. I expect you to be strong. I would not respect you if you were not. I do not want Christianity professed only by weakness. I want to see it a moving spirit among men of strength. I do not expect you to lose one particle of your strength or courage by being decent. On the contrary I should hope to see each man who is a member of this society from his membership in it becomes all the fitter to do the rough work of the world, all the fitter to work in time of peace, and if, which may happen, to fight in time of war."

Official Order Issued

He was not a Catholic, for which reason the special order, entitled "Society of the Holy Name," which he issued on February 4, 1918, takes on an added importance.

The Order follows:
Society of the Holy Name:
1. Officers: N. C. O. and Man of the Brigade are invited to study the leaflet with the above title, which will soon be distributed to all ranks.

2. The subject in calling this matter to the attention of the Brigade is to emphasize the importance of refraining from blasphemy and vice or indecent language, and to point out that there is a great necessity for the prayers of all that our cause may be victorious. Even the best soldiers gain strength from and are better for, prayer.

3. The subject is to form a society which, when formed, will be composed of thinking men who realize that morale is as vital to the success of the Army as proficiency in arms and plentiful munitions, and further, that morale in the best sense, cannot be separated from religion.

4. The aim of the Society is to honor the name of Jesus Christ by invoking the blessing of God on our arms and so obtain victory.

5. The members of the Society undertake on their word of honor—

a) To hold in honor, love and reverence the name of God, and Our Lord Jesus Christ.

Consequently

b) To avoid all improper use of profanity, cursing in his own vain talk. To avoid all blasphemy.

c) To restrain their tongues from foul language, from all indecency in speech, hearty support.

6. The whole subject will be placed before the Brigade and fully explained by the Chaplain on three consecutive Sundays.

7. A leaflet dealing with the subject will be distributed to the Company Commanders, so that each man in the Brigade will have a copy.

8. Officers: Names Registered

When the subject matter has been read, and thought over by the men for a week, each Platoon Commander will get the names of every N. C. O. and man who wishes to join the Society.

The method of becoming a member is—

a) To sign the promise on last page of leaflet and hand same to Platoon Commander

b) To inform the Platoon Commander that he is willing to undertake what the Society requires although he does not care to sign any form.

The signatures, as well as names of those desiring up but not signing, shall be handed to O. C. Companies who will give them to a Chaplain for enrollment.

8. A preliminary meeting of the Commanding Officers and the Platoon Officers of the Brigade will be called at some time and date to be fixed later, to consider the aims of the Society and to devise further ways of promoting the same.

It is hoped that the Society shall have Members from every Canadian unit in France and as it originated within this Brigade, that all members of the Brigade shall give it their hearty support.

Comments on Letters

Under date of May 27, 1918, a further special Brigade Order was issued by General MacBrien, publishing commendatory letters with reference to the formation of the Holy Name Society.

Lieut. General (later Sir) Arthur Currie, Commanding Canadian Corps, who approved this movement and said it would like to be enrolled as a member (General Currie was not a Catholic).

Major General (later Sir) A. C. Macdonell, Commanding 11 Canadian Division, who said, "We should all be the better for reading it (the leaflet), and adhering to the Society of the Holy Name will be a prop and a support." (General Macdonell was not a Catholic).

Major General G. Lipsett, Commanding 3rd Canadian Division, expressed the hope that the pamphlet will have a wide circulation in the Division and be sympathetically considered by all ranks.

SEYSS-QUIRT SCORES 'QUADRAGESIMO ANNO' AS FOREIGN DOCUMENT

BERLIN—A recent issue of *Der Angriff* contains an article by Herr Hitler for Austria Dr. Seyss-Quirt on the first anniversary of the Anschluss. It is interesting to note the manner in which this former member of the Schuschnigg Cabinet and of the Catholic Action association of his parish in Vienna, refers to the Encyclical Quadragesimo Anno.

After commenting on the defeat of Marxism in Austria, he speaks of "particularist clerical reaction of the regime of the Patriotic Front" which was revealed as "wholly incapable of mastering the situation." "Searching feverishly," he adds, "for a program that would justify this domination, it turned toward what is called the Encyclical Quadragesimo Anno. Its doctrine was borrowed from this document—perfectly foreign to the German people, inorganic, and thus the Christian Corporative State" was born, the child of chance and lacking imagination.
