'Holy Name Journal' Article Reveals Vast Sources of Indecent Literature

In line with the launching of Bishop Kearney's Campaign Against Indecent Literature by the Rochester Diocesan Holy Name Union in Hornell, Sunday, April 15 is the following article in the April issue of the Holy Name Journal. In a foreword the Holy Name Society organ states: "The natural right of normal people is to be free of obscene literature. It is forbidden to write filth on the walls of a public building, why sweep over the refusal of society to allow the same filth to be printed in a literary magazine?"

Parliament Members Flay Indecent Magazine Flood

OTTAWA—Debate on the Canada-United States trade treaty was the occasion for a forceful reminder in the House of Commons by Conservative members of Parliament that a flood of salacious literature is entering the Dominion. The item under review dealt with the free entry of periodical publications.

Doctors Massey, Conservative of Ontario, who is a member of the United Church of Canada and is the judge of the York Bible Class, said: "The mass of salacious literature that is being poured into this country is a disgrace to our civilization and a danger to our youth."

F. E. Lennard, Conservative of Westworth, who is an Anglican, said: "It might draw attention to the fact that some of these magazines and periodicals which come into Canada have been banned in certain of the United States. I understand that several of them are not allowed to circulate in Chicago and other western cities."
