Prayers for Peace Urged Bishop During May

By a request of His Holiness, Pope Pius XII for peace during the month of May, His Excellency, Rev. James E. Kearney, Bishop of Rochester has issued the following letter addressed to pastors of the diocese:

FOR PEACE

"One of the first requests from the lips of Our Holy Father, Pius XII, is his request for a crusade of prayer for peace, a children's crusade. He has suggested that the crusade take the form of May Devotions to Our Blessed Lady, in recognition of this special Our Holy Father's request, I should like you to assemble your children for this devotion during the month of May before the opening of school. Let some of the children in the recitation of the Rosary during the Holy Sacrifice, and then let them recite the three prayers for peace chosen from the Missal which are enclosed. One of their hymns to Our Blessed Lady sung by the entire group would complete the service which would be at once a delightful May tribute to Our Lady, Queen of May, and a gracious and loyal response to the request of the Sovereign Pontiff.

May I suggest, also, where the altar arrangement makes it all practical, that the Mass be offered at the altar of Our Lady suitably decorated in honor of Her month, with the children assembled as far as possible in the altar railing. Let the Confident of Your children's operation in this significant crusade of prayer. I am Your devoted Shepherd in Christ.

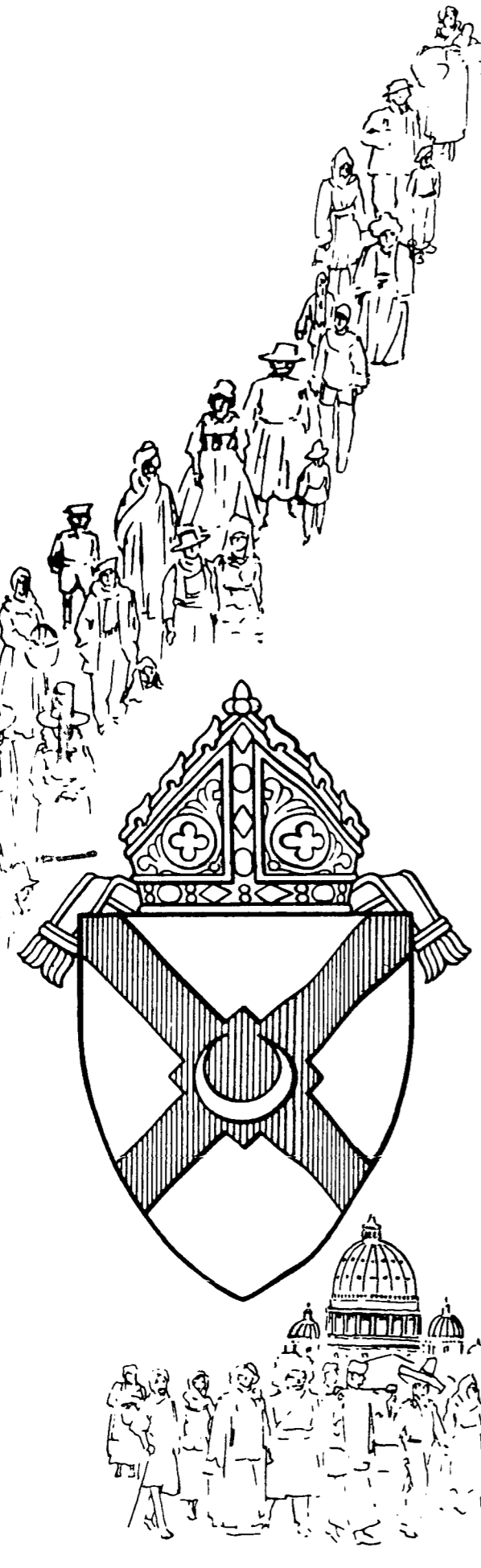

Catholic Faith Firm Formed
