BRIGHT SPOT IN BULGARIA

Old Chapel is Now Too Small
 Out of every thousand persons in Bulgaria only one is Catholic. So we see what work there is to be done. The Bulgarians belong to the Orthodox or separated church. Father Julian, of the village of Plovdiv writes: "In this village, we have a high school. We have been going for nearly ten years and our school is a great success. There are eight priests who teach and three laymen. We have two hundred students, the greater part children of the separated people. We find these young men to be naturally religious. Without any compulsion, they attend the daily religious instructions and are present at Mass on Sunday. Every year we have converts. You see our chapel is the chapel for the Catholics of the village. So every Sunday not only do the boys attend Mass, but their parents also. Since January of the year a right families have become Catholics.
