

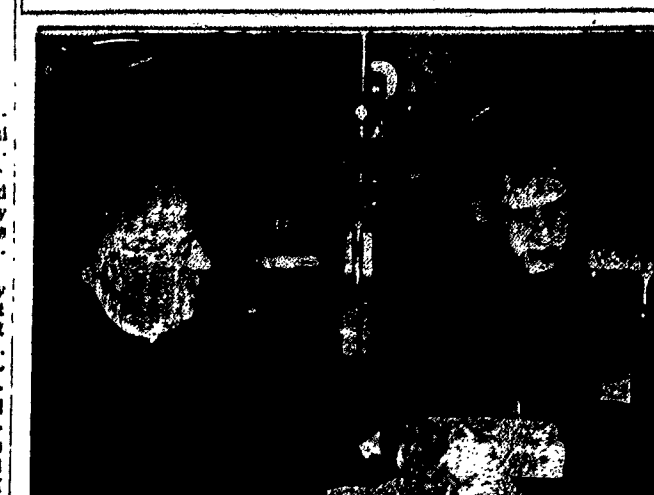
120 CHILDREN BORN DURING RED ROLL IN SPAIN BAPTIZED
