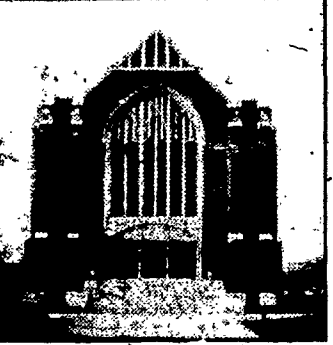

30 Bishops Endorse 'Catholic Faith' Set

WASHINGTON. Thirty Bishops thus far have endorsed "Catholic Faith," a series of three books on Christian Doctrine in catechetical form, just published by the Catholic University of America here. It is announced.

"Catholic Faith" represents the fruit of five years of labor by a commission appointed, under the personal supervision of the Rector of the Catholic University, to bring out a new catechism based on Cardinal Gasparri's Latin Catechism, which has been approved for use throughout the world. The Catholic University has used this authoritative text in preparing the new Catechism, which meets the needs of the Church in America today.

The Rev. Dr. Felix M. Kirsch, O. M. Cap., Professor of Religious Education at the Catholic University, has been in charge of the work of bringing out the new Catechism to make sure that the doctrine defined in "Catholic Faith" would be in perfect harmony with the doctrine as stated by Cardinal Gasparri, Sister M. Brendan, Community Superior of the Sisters Servants of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, was in charge of the wording of "Catholic Faith," a simple and vivid language.

Catholic Daughters Visit New York's World Fair

NEW YORK. More than 1,500 members of the Catholic Daughters of the Americas attended the New York World's Fair last week, holding a celebration in the Temple of Religion as the closing session of their national convention in Detroit.

Miss Mary C. Duffy, Supreme Regent, reviewing the activities of the organization, said that in the three years before 1936 to 1939 a total of \$91,000 was expended on charitable projects.

The Rt. Rev. Msgr. Thomas J. McDonnell, National Director of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith, said that those exhibits at the World's Fair which tend to edify and aid the spectators in their preparation for eternal life justify the existence of the exposition.

Bohemia Prelate Flees to Poland

PRAGUE. Monsignor Jan Sramek, former Czech minister of the Czechoslovak Republic, was reported today to have fled across the border into Poland, accompanied by his secretary, M. Hala, a leader of the Catholic Populist Party.

Monsignor Sramek was one of the most distinguished prelates in Bohemia and Moravia. His report of escape was followed by intense activity on the part of the Nazi secret police. Homes of members of the clergy were searched and several railway workers were arrested.
