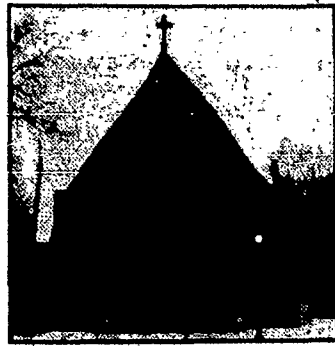

OLOMOUC, Moravia. There are no vacant parishes in the Archdiocese of Olomouc. Arrangements have been made there by Archbishop Leopold Preean, whereby all priest-catechists have been superseded by lay teachers, mostly women trained in special courses while the priests have been given parish posts.

Anti-Christian Bill Defeated in India

BANGALORE, India. (NC) At a session of the Mysore Legislative Assembly a resolution was moved demanding that a law be passed to enforce the registration of converts from Hinduism to other religions. The convert, according to the proposed measure would be required to declare his intention to change his religion seven days before the act before a competent officer of the State and record it again seven days later. The proposed legislation was meant to stem the tide of conversions from Hinduism to Islam and Christianity by imposing unnecessary restrictions, but it was defeated by a strong majority. The Christian members, Moslems, and the Official Group voted against it.

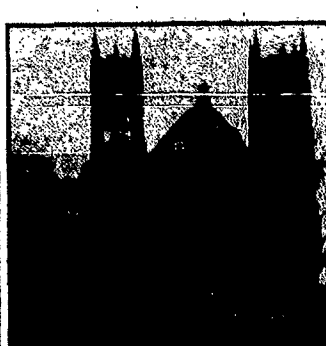
