#### European Crisis Keeps NBC Staff Going At Top Speed

The dramatic European crisis,

upsetting the smooth course of scheduled network programs, has kept the staff of NBC's many departments going at top-speed. Long after the last of the studio visitors have departed, the normally staid corridors of Radio City are alive with activity as engineers, announcers, newsmen and program arrangers dash about trying to keep things moving efficiently on both networks, and at the same time get a bit to eat and a little sleep on any

A small commissary department has been created, with an army of boys dashing large quantities of sandwiches and coffee to harassed NBC officials and weary employees, bearing the brunt of the many on-thespot broadcasts and news programs put on the air day and

WASHINGTON. - (NC) - The shadow of war, already full upon the more than 300 foreign delegates attending the eighteenth annual congress of Pax Romana last week plerced the council chambers of the Executive Committee and forced decisions of a momentous nature in what otherwise would have been routine business sessions terminating deliberations of


