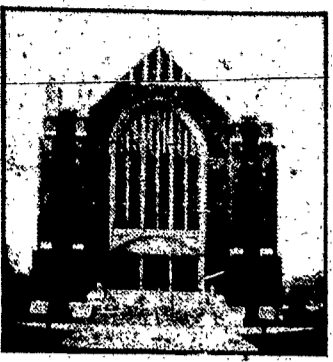

JESUIT COLLEGE IN INDIA
OBSERVES GOLDEN JUBILEE
KUSKONG, India.—Five thousand feet above sea level, within easy reach of Darjeeling, famed for its tea, the Jesuit government officials from low-lying Bengal report during the hot and rainy season, stands Kuskong. Here just half a century ago the Jesuit Fathers of the Belgian Province of the Holy Spirit College, now the recognized all-India theological training center for members of the Society of Jesus.

During the fifty years of its existence St. Mary's College has trained 650 Jesuits for work in various parts of India. Seven ex-students of the College have been raised to the Episcopacy.

About 150 past pupils of the College recently attended the Golden Jubilee celebrations. To commemorate this event it was decided to build a new library.
