Central Verein Asks For Strict Neutrality

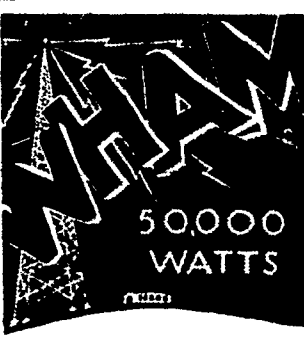
