On September 21, 1909, Monsignor Mundelein was consecrated Titular Bishop of Loryma and Auxiliary Bishop of Brooklyn. At the same time, Bishop Mundelein became Rector of what was then known as the Cathedral Chapel, which he soon found too small conveniently to accommodate the congregation that worshipped there. Bishop Mundelein huik an addifice which, while combining a church, a school and a rectory in the one structure, was at the same time a work of great architectural beauty. The entire editice was built according to the Bishop's own ideas.

Interest in Education

Bishop Mundelein's interest in education was manifested by the parts he played in the building of schools. The school was his first thought when he became Rector of the Cathedrai Chapel.

Bishop Mundelein was named Archbishop of Chicago, succeeding the late Most Rev. James Edward Quigley (native of Rechester), on December 9, 1915. He was solemnly installed on February 9, 1915, with His Excellency. Archbishop John Bonzano, Apostolic Delegates to the United States, presiding.

The promptness with which his labors in the Archbishop of Chicago is reflected by the fact that it was as soon after his inchicago is reflected by the fact that it was as soon after his in-stallation on April 28, 1916, that he appointed a Board of School Su-pervisors to co-ordinate the work of Catholic schools throughout the See, and on May 14, 1916, that there was read from every pulpit of the Archdiocese a letter from Archbishop Mundelein outlining his plan for the srection of a Quig-

ley Preparatory Seminary as memorial to his predecessor. The thoroughness with which the Archbishop had laid his plans in so short a time was estonishing. Plans were drawn and everything in connection with the project had been taken into consideration. The site, one-half of a city block, had

been selected. Without ostentation, ground for the preparatory seminary was broken in the last wask of No-vember, 1916, a little over nine months after the Archbishop's arrival in his See. Less than a year after that, on September 18, 1917 the Archbishop laid the corner-stone of the structure.

Plans for Major Seminary On April 16, 1920, at a time when preparations were being made to observe the diamond jubiles of the founding of the Archdiocesa of Chicago and the sacerdotal silver blishop was able to make the first public announcement of his plan to erect a major seminary.-St.

Just two wacks later, April 30, 1920, amnouncement was made that Mr. and Mrs. Edward Hines of Chicago had determined to make a gift of \$500,000 to the proposed seminary as a memorial to their son, Lieut. Edward Hines, Jr., who had died of pneumonia in a base hospital in France. The 1921 graduating class of

Quigley Preparatory Seminary found everything in readiness for their reception at the major seminary of St. Mary of the Lake on October 5 of that same year. No special ceremony attended this event, yet it was an occasion of deep significance. It marked the beginning of a program of ec-clesiagatical aducation in the Archclessagical education in the Arondioesse of Chicago which in a few
years more was to win the recoginition of the Church to such an extent that the Holy Father was to
permit its faculty to confer upon
quilified atudents that crowning

quilified students that crowning glory of theological study, the Doctorate of Sacred Theology.

The site—a thousand-acre tract—selected for the major seminary was in the township of Area, Ill., the name of which the citizens changed, by unanimous vote, to Mundelein, in tribute to the Archbishop of Chicago. The develorment of the seminary project was already magnificent at the time of ment of the seminary project was already magnificent at the time of the Twenty-eighth International Eucharistic Congress in 1926, the closing ceremonies of which were held there. At the time of the silver jubilee of Cardinal Mundelein's episcopal consecration, in 1934, it was amnounced that the seminary moder was virtually completed. project was virtually completed.

cation came a year later, in June.
1935, at the fourteenth annual commencement of the Seminary of St. Mary of the Lake. At that time Cardinal Mundelein announced the Cardinal Mundelein announced the putchase of a house in Rome for graduate students of the Archdiocese of Chicago, This institution is known as the Collegio Santa Maria del Lago (College of St. Mary of the Lake).
