**President Roosevelt To Open Drive of Mobilization for Human Needs**

President Franklin D. Roosevelt will inaugurate the 1939 community mobilization for Human Needs in a radio appeal over the combined networks of the National Broadcasting Company, Monday, October 9, from 10:30 to 11:00 P. M. EST. Charles P. Taft of Cincinnati, who will again be chairman of the annual community chest campaign, will introduce the President.

The drive, which ends November 11, will be conducted by community chest chapters in more than 450 cities. Last year more than 9,000,000 individuals contributed to their local associations. President Roosevelt's plan is to mobilize more than half-million volunteer workers throughout the country on an intensive fund raising campaign to take care of local relief and charity cases.

"Good Americans Are Good Neighbors" will be the slogan for the 1939 campaign, which marks the 25th anniversary of the community chest movement in the United States. Funds will be used to provide hospital care and finance family welfare work and other public services. The program will open and close with selections by the United States Army Band.

**Benny Starts Ninth Season**  
 With 782,221 applicants for the tenor role vacated by Kenny Baker (the 1/2 is for a singer) amidst war rattle, has a bass voice. Jack Benny will begin his ninth consecutive season of NBC broadcasts on Sunday, October 8, by continuing his search for a singer. The broadcast, re-starring over WHAM at 7:00 P. M. EST, will find Mary Livingston, Don Wilson, Andy Devine, Rochester, and Phil Harris and his orchestra back to back in the comedian and reminiscer over their fourteen-week vacation. During the summer, Benny was fated at a great homecoming celebration in Waukegan, motored 10,000 miles around the country, auditioned "several thousand" tenors, witnessed two championship prize fights, participated in the American Legion Convention in Chicago, and successfully avoided Fred Allen.

**The Parker Family Starts on WHAM**  
 Leon Janney's portrayal of "Booth Tarkington," "Paradise," "Seventeen" and "His Father's Son" have won him fame as "the real American boy." It started in similar role in "The Parker Family," dramatic serial which made its bow over WHAM Sunday, October 1, the program will be heard weekly at 9:15 P. M. EST, sponsored by E. H. Woodbury, Inc. in the interests of Woodbury Soap. Janney plays the leading role of "Richard the Great," typical American boy who wants to be "somebody" for the sake of his sweetheart. Mitti Gould as his sister Nancy, Jay Joslyn as his father and Lynda Carlson as his mother form the supporting cast.

**Sports Newswear**  
 A unique radio version of the newswear will be inaugurated by Bill Stern under the title of Sports Newswear of the Air on Sunday, October 8, at 4:45 P. M. EST, over WHAM. The broadcast will be divided into five "reels," during one of which will interview as his first guest Babe Ruth, baseball's perennial king of swine. Ruth is expected to discuss the world's series. The Arnequin Quartet will be heard at the opening and closing of the program.

**Midwestern Football**  
 The Golden Gophers of the University of Minnesota will invade Memorial Stadium in Lincoln, Neb., to battle the Cornhuskers in a football game to be heard Saturday, October 7, at 2:45 P. M. EST, over WHAM. The struggle will mark the start of Minnesota's attempt to reach the heights which Coach Bierman's teams held up to two years ago. Nebraska, always a dangerous opponent, will take the field without all-American Charley Brock, lost through graduation. Bill Stern, sports reporter for the Blue Network, will do the play-by-play picture of the proceedings.

**Cardinal Mundelein Had Illustrious Career**

for the deepest joy in the Archdiocese of Chicago, a joy in which non-Catholics of the great Midwest freely joined. The return of His Eminence from Rome on Sunday, May 11, 1924, saw him receiving the warmest felicitations and heartfelt good wishes from the whole of the great metropolis. Two days later, after a solemn Mass of Thanksgiving for his return, celebrated in the Cathedral of the Holy Name, His Eminence was presented with a check for one million dollars, the gift to the clergy and people for the Seminary of St. Mary of the Lake.

By special permission of the Holy Father, the newly-ordained priest celebrated his first Mass in the crypt of the Vatican Basilica at the tomb of St. Peter. Returning to Brooklyn with his Bishop, Father Mundelein was made assistant secretary to the Ordinary. At the same time he took charge of a Lithuanian Church at Williamsburg, ministering there on Saturdays and Sundays. In 1897, he was made Chancellor of the Diocese of Brooklyn, and began to make an even more marked impression on the affairs of the diocese.

On September 21, 1909, Monsignor Mundelein was consecrated Bishop of Brooklyn by his Bishop, Cardinal Hayes. At the same time, Bishop Mundelein became Rector of what was then known as the Cathedral Chapel, which he soon found too small conveniently to accommodate the congregation that worshipped there. Bishop Mundelein built an edifice which, while combining a church, a school and a factory in the one structure, was at the same time a work of great architectural beauty. The entire edifice was built according to the Bishop's own plan.

Interest in Education  
 Bishop Mundelein's interest in education was manifested by the part he played in the building of schools. The school was his first thought when he became Rector of the Cathedral of St. Mary.

Bishop Mundelein was named Archbishop of Chicago, succeeding the late Most Rev. James Edward Quigley (nephew of Rochester), on December 9, 1915. He was solemnly installed on February 9, 1916, with His Excellency, Archbishop John Bonzano, Apostolic Delegate to the United States, presiding. The Archbishop of Chicago is reflected by the fact that it was at his instigation that the installation on April 28, 1916, that he appointed a Board of School Supervisors to co-ordinate the work of Catholic schools throughout the city.

On April 16, 1920, at a time when preparations were being made to observe the diamond jubilee of the founding of the Archdiocese of Chicago and the sacerdotal silver jubilee of his Ordinary, the Archbishop was able to make a public announcement of his plan to erect a major seminary—St. Mary of the Lake.

Just two weeks later, April 30, 1920, announcements that Monsignor and Mrs. Edward Hines of Chicago had determined to make a gift of \$500,000 to the proposed seminary as a memorial to their son, Lt. Edward Hines, Jr., who had died of pneumonia in a base hospital in France.
