

INTERNATIONAL POPE'S EFFORTS — ART SAVED MASS FOR VICTORY

'Blue Book' Shows Pope's Peace Aid

LONDON—Repeated evidence of the peace activities of His Holiness Pope Pius XII are contained in a new British "Blue Book" of documents and reports of diplomatic conversations bearing upon the war in Europe.

References to the Holy Father's efforts are contained in quotations from Foreign Minister Lord Halifax, Sir Neville Henderson, who was the British Ambassador in Berlin, Sir Basil Liddell Hart, British Ambassador in Warsaw, and Sir Robert C. Ogden, British Minister to the Holy See.

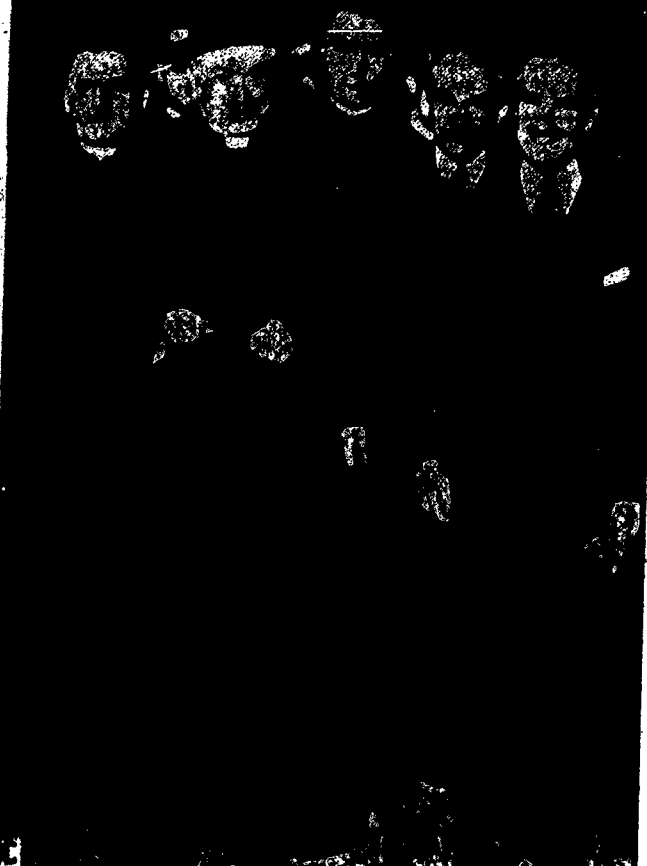
"On August 27, Sir Howard Kennard, British Ambassador in Warsaw, reported to Lord Halifax: 'As the Pope has said that the Pope has, during the night through the Vatican, asked if there was anything he could do to help in the war, that he was prepared to consider an exchange of populations and also use of neutral observers in order to demonstrate that German accusations of mistreatment were completely without foundation.'

"The Pope could then communicate these proposals to the German Government with approval of Polish Government."

"Lord Halifax sent the following telegram to Mr. D'Arcy Osborne, British Minister to the Holy See, on August 28, in connection with the Pope's broadcast appeal for peace: 'Please inform the Cardinal Secretary of State, or if it is possible the Pope himself, that His Majesty's Government have much appreciated the news and the Pope's appeal for peace which His Holiness broadcast to the world last night.'

"The Cardinal Secretary of State has just handed me a note of appreciation referred to the Pope's broadcast. It should wish His Holiness to know in a more direct manner of the response which his words have evoked in the hearts and minds not only of His Majesty's Government, but of the people of this country as a whole."

CARDINAL LEADS POLISH PILGRIMS



His Eminence Augustus Cardinal Hlond, Primate of Poland, Archbishop of Gnesen and Fosen and the Ambassador of Poland to the Holy See as they arrived at Castel Gandolfo, where the Cardinal led a pilgrimage from his war-torn country and was greeted by the Holy Father with a conciling discourse which brought tears to the eyes of many. Victory High Mass Offered By Cardinal

LONDON—High Mass for the victory of the Allied armies was offered at Westminster Cathedral with His Eminence Arthur Cardinal Hinsley presiding.

Throughout the country, at the suggestion of the Privy Council, the day was observed as a day of intercession.

Cardinal Hinsley directed that in every church and chapel Mass be offered and special supplication be made to the Lord of Mercies to beg His assistance and the blessing of His peace through the triumph of light."

France At War Moves To Save Church Art

PARIS—(NC)—Fear of air-raids has occasioned the greatest care and precaution in safeguarding the priceless stained glass and other church treasures in France, particularly the windows of Chartres and Bourges cathedrals. Last year, when war seemed imminent, the windows were removed but had been put back in place after the Munich Conference. Before the present war commenced, the glass was again put in safe place.

At Chartres, because of protective measures that were being taken, the Cathedral was closed temporarily. On the Feast of the Nativity of the Virgin, the Most Rev. Raoul Haerzout, Bishop of Chartres, pontificated at a solemn Mass outside the south portal. Regular services are now being held in the subterranean chapel. Bishop Haerzout has made a vow that if the city escapes bombardment, to which it is exposed particularly because of its nearness to an aviation camp, that solemn ceremonies will be held annually during the Octave of the Nativity of the Virgin, and a monument will be erected in which the relics of the veil of the Virgin will be exposed perpetually.

The windows have been removed from the Cathedrals of Metz, Strasbourg, Rheims and other Cathedrals, and from Notre Dame, St. Chapelle, St. Severin, St. Etienne du Mont and the Basilica of St. Denis at Paris. Precautions have been taken to protect the interior and exterior sculptures of all religious edifices in danger of bombardment. Valuable paintings have been removed from their frames and placed in boxes under a layer of sandstone. Where this was not possible, other measures have been adopted. For example, in the Church of St. Sulpice, at Paris, the celebrated frescoes by Eugene Delacroix are protected by a metal shield supported by sand-bags.

The lessons of the World War have not been forgotten and, this time, the Catholic world should suffer less loss of masterpieces of religious art. MISSION SUNDAY, OCT. 22
