Corpus Christi Parish TO BLESS BAPTISTRY

Bishop Kearney will be at Corpus Christi Church on Sunday, October 22, to perform a solemn blessing of the new Baptistry which has been erected in the front vestibule as a memorial to Michael and Emily Anderson Naughton by their children.

The Baptistry is a pleasant addition to the equipment of the Church, and its design and construction conform with the Gothic style of the Church.

Rev. William Naughton, son of Mr. and Mrs. Michael Naughton, will assist Bishop Kearney at the ceremony and blessing.

Immediately after the services, Bishop Kearney will confirm a class of one hundred ninety boys and girls. Sponsors are asked to be in their places at 4:15 o'clock, as the confirmation services will begin at 4:30 P. M.

Father Randall wishes to thank the people of Corpus Christi Church for their generous contributions to the missions on last Sunday, which amounted to \$133. This amount is far above that of last year, and it indicates the hearty reception on the part of the people of Corpus Christi of Father Randall's splendid presentation of the cause of the Mission. Supplementary offerings may be made on Sunday, October 22.

Rosary Devotions will be held daily after the 8 o'clock Mass and at 2:30 P. M. on Sunday afternoon. The Perpetual Novena in honor of the Eucharistic Heart of Jesus will be held on Thursday afternoon at 3:30 o'clock and in the evening at 8 o'clock.

The League of the Sacred Heart will meet after the services for the Eucharistic Novena. A message from Msgr. Hart: We are pleased to see some growth in the number of boys and girls attending the Monday evening classes in religious instruction. These classes are for the public school pupils. There are still several of these pupils whom we would like to see in regular attendance at 7:30 o'clock on Monday evenings.

The Aquinas collection for 1939 will be taken up on Sunday, October 22. Envelopes will be distributed on October 22. Corpus Christi Church must pay \$1125 each year to be turned in as part of a fund that will provide for those boys who are unable to pay tuition or who can pay only part of the tuition.

The parishes give this fund to Bishop Kearney each year so that no boy will be kept out of Aquinas simply because of lack of funds. A religious entertainment will be given in Corpus Christi Hall on Friday, November 3 at 3 and 8 o'clock. It will consist of a musical picture of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

Msgr. Lavelle's Death Mourned Here (Continued from Page 1) He was once described by one of his closest friends as "a holy priest, those who will show to the parish since a picture of this nature will enable those who see it to assist more devoutly at Mass. Another distinction which was his was that of having celebrated the diamond jubilee, or sixtieth anniversary of his ordination as a priest. The venerable monsignor, who was a personal friend of thousands of Catholics, celebrates the sixtieth anniversary of his ordination on June 7, 1939. Unusual honors were paid to him then by church and city. His Excellency, Bishop Kearney was among the distinguished members of the hierarchy present to congratulate the aged prelate.

In his capacity as Prothonotary Apostolic, permitting him to wear a Bishop's miter, ring and pectoral cross, Monsignor Lavelle commemorated the event by celebrating a pontifical Mass in the Cathedral. He was elevated to the rank of Prothonotary Apostolic by Pope Pius XI in June, 1929, when the monsignor celebrated his golden jubilee as a priest. Twenty-three years earlier he had been appointed a Domestic Prelate, with the title of Right Reverend Monsignor by Pope Pius X.

Monsignor Lavelle was born in New York on May 30, 1858, in the parish of old St. Patrick's Cathedral. He was baptized and confirmed there and attended the old Cathedral parochial school. In early youth he served as an altar boy in the old Cathedral. One of his greatest childhood honors was his selection as one of two altar boys to hold up the long flowing scarlet train of the Most Rev. John McCloskey, second Archbishop of New York at the service of the investiture of that prelate as the first Cardinal in the United States. He attended De LaSalle Institute, Manhattan College and St. Joseph's Theological Seminary, then at Troy, Ordained at 23.

The young seminarian was ordained at the age of 23 by Bishop Wadhams of Ogdensburg, and assigned as an assistant on the staff of the new St. Patrick's Cathedral on June 15, 1879, by Archbishop Corrigan. He was appointed administrator of the Cathedral in April, 1887, on the death of the

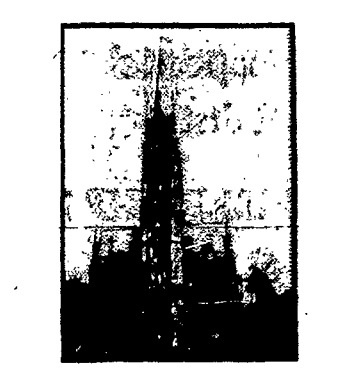
