St. Mary's Boys Home Marks 75th Anniversary

November 1, the Feast of All Saints, in this year of 1889 marked a seventy-fifth milestone in the path of one of Rochester's oldest institutions for the care of children—St. Mary's Home for Boys.

The Home on Wednesday morning took on a festive air. His Excellency, the Most Rev. James J. Conroy, D.D., offering the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, Thanksgiving for the blessings that have accrued to the boys of St. Mary's since the inception of the institution.

The children's songs, rendered with the utmost spirit, and the choir singing the hymn "The Lord's Prayer" with the heavenly melody of the "Agnus Dei" of the Mass.

Founded During Civil War
The history of St. Mary's Boys Home reaches the year 1864, and indicates the fine reputation for excellent administration attained by those in charge.

In 1864, Rev. J. M. Barry, pastor of St. Mary's Church, purchased a three-story brick structure at 1 South Street, to house boys of the Rochester diocese who had been bereft of parents or guardians in the great Civil conflict between the North and the South.
