Peril to Present Form of Government Questioned in Town Meeting Debate

Is the present constitutional form of government in the United States in peril? An ardent New Dealer, and an antagonist who has fought New Deal changes, will argue the question during America's Town Meeting of the Air on Saturday, November 4.

U. S. Solicitor General Robert H. Jackson and Frederick H. Wood, celebrated New York attorney, will be the protagonists during the broadcast at 7:30 P. M. EST. over WHAM, on the formal subject, "Is Our Constitutional Government in Danger?"

Solicitor General Jackson will argue that changing times call for certain changes in the form of government. Wood, on the other hand, will contend that the New Deal is getting away entirely from the precepts of the Constitution.

Active for many years in public life, Jackson has been a member of the New York State Commission to Investigate the Administration of Justice; chairman of the National Conference of Bar Association Delegates; a trustee in the 20th Century Fund; and an executive member of the New York State Bar Association.

Wood has argued many famous cases before the United States Supreme Court, including the Schechter Case, involving the constitutionality of the defunct NRA; the Carter Case, dealing with the Guffey Bituminous Coal Conservation Act; and the Gold Clause Case. Both speakers have appeared previously on the Town Meeting platform. George V. Denny, Jr., president of Town Hall, Inc., will act as moderator.

"Drama Guide" for Great Plays Available; Libraries to Assist Collateral Reading

Students of the theater and members of the radio audience at large who make up an enthusiastic following for the National Broadcasting Company's Great Plays, may now obtain an attractive and exhaustive "Drama Guide" to the present series of 28 masterpieces being produced on Sunday afternoons over WHAM.

The 131-page book was written by Elyvina Davis who is associated with Lewis H. Titterton, head of the NBC Script Division and William S. Rainey, manager of the production department, in the planning of the Great Plays series. It has been printed by the Columbia University Press and is for sale at Columbia University, New York, for 35 cents per copy.

The guide contains a complete list of this year's plays as well as those in the first and second series. It contains interesting background material about each of the forthcoming productions and a complete bibliography representing a list of books which may be found in the majority of public and school libraries.

Several pages are devoted to informative essays on each play. These give the date of the premiere broadcast, material on the author, estimates of the value of the drama by its outstanding critics and interesting notes about the great actors who have played the leading roles. The American Library Association is co-operating closely with NBC by having its member libraries prepare each week a special shelf of reading material based on recommendations found in the book.

Industrious Script Writer Makes Tom Mix Serial Director's Ideal

The dream of every radio director has been realized in the Adventures of Tom Mix serial program heard Mondays through Fridays at 5:45 P. M. EST. over WHAM. For the first time in network radio history it is believed, 65 complete scripts, representing 13 weeks' programs, were in the hands of Director C. L. Menser before the initial episode was aired.

"The best synopsis for the full 13 weeks was thrashed out and agreed upon in story conferences during the summer," Menser explains. "This simplifies everyone's problems—the casting director's, and those members of the cast itself. Each actor knows far in advance the exact dates on which he is to appear in the drama."

The plan was evolved only after a long study of juvenile radio programs and careful research into all the factors that make for wholesome entertainment, education information and inspirational adventure, according to Menser. He believes this method of program building gives the Tom Mix broadcast a definite dramatic architecture and early American history throughout the entire series.
