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Nun From Rochester Relates
Experiences In New Guinea

An insight into the life of a missionary Sister in New Guinea may be gleaned from the letter of Sister Theophane (nee Mrs. Maier), Servant of the Holy Ghost, to her mother, Mrs. W. Maier, 378 Clinton Avenue North.

Sister tells of many strange incidents such as the time she had to operate on a horse which had been injured pulling an automobile. She describes the apparatus of some of the Kanakas natives dressed in their feathers and shells; their bewilderment at buildings, ships, autos, church services, etc. The bishop asked one of the natives for his spear. The native replied that it was a new spear and had no value. As soon as he killed someone, he would be pleased to present it to the bishop.

These natives, according to Sister Theophane, were very friendly and did not seem to be afraid of the white man. They rubbed their skins with pig grease. One smells their proximity almost before visualizing it. In church it was very "loud."

She also tells about the Jubilee celebration and the Pontifical Mass celebrated by Bishop Wade of the Solomon Islands. About two thousand received Holy Communion as natives came in from all parts and islands.

One of the more amusing things Sister Theophane describes is the timidity of the natives to accept some Neelies chocolates. He accepted it cautiously, ate it slowly and all of a sudden his face became illuminated and he gobbled it up and asked for more. A flock of natives soon followed the poor priest until every single piece of candy was gone.

A terrible accident happened in which three priests and a catechist were killed in a mission country. This is an innumerable loss. The accident was so awful that strong men fainted at it. In twelve months this little mission has buried twelve of its mission force.
