NAZIS ADD RESTRICTIONS TO CHURCH COLLECTIONS

BERLIN—Catholic charity and education have been subjected to new attacks in Nazi Germany. The Minister of the Interior has prohibited the collecting of money in churches for charitable works is still permissible. The sale of publications and calendars, the proceeds of which aided various church charities, is now forbidden and other concessions have been withdrawn.

In an article published in the September issue of the National-Catholicist, Alfred Rosenberg ridiculed the presence of "the worst enemies of true science" in liberal universities. "It is an aberration," he says, "to permit a university, at the side of exact sciences, the teaching of magical practices of religious liturgy, and theology, which denies science, to be on the same footing with philosophy and science. We must put an end to such nonsense."

Adult Education Classes Begin Winter Term

Registration for the winter term of adult education classes at Monroe High Evening School will begin Thursday, November 30, according to William E. Hawley, Principal.

A new high record in adult registration was reached at the school with a total of 4,254, which is 441 ahead of the same period last year. With the new term's added registration it is expected nearly 7,000 will have registered, exceeding last year's total by 500.

Eighty-six courses, from auto-mechanics to rhythmic playing, make up the curriculum of Monroe High Evening. The most extensive of these are the thirty evening schools. Nearly 100 teachers comprise the school's faculty.
