

FURTHER AIDS IN WINTER WORK ISSUED BY F. H. A.

Following the prediction of Federal Housing Administrator Stewart McDonald that the current winter season would be one of continuous operation for the home construction industry, the F. H. A.'s Technical Division has issued additional suggestions to guide builders who work where low temperatures prevail.

These precautions concern the use in construction of brick, stone, tile, concrete blocks, plaster, and stucco.

Brick, Stone, Tile and Blocks Dry, clean, pervious brick commonly gives better results in cold weather than impervious brick.

Plaster and Stucco Warm sand and heat water to about 140 to 175 degrees F. Artificial heat should not be used at too high temperatures, and heat should not be concentrated on certain areas of walls or ceilings.

Sufficient ventilation should be provided in drying plaster so the moisture will be raised out of building and not driven into the walls over which the plaster is applied.

Avoid forcing moisture-laden air into attic. Walls: walls are insulated, omit the installation of ceiling insulation until after the plaster is thoroughly dry.

BOND EMPLOYEES SHARE IN \$150,000 DIVIDENDS

Nearly 2,300 Rochester factory employees of Bond Clothier, Inc. will soon be recipients of better than \$150,000 Christmas gift in the form of wage dividends based on the earnings of the company this year.

In commenting upon the profit sharing with the employees Mr. Barney Ruben, vice-president of the company stated: "Having confidence in the American Way" this year Bond opened six new additional stores, three of them on the West Coast, a territory new to Bond, making a total of 58 outlets in the principal cities of the United States.

Ruben also stated that a similar dividend of between \$30,000 and \$50,000 was in store for the 1,000 employees in the Bond plant at New Brunswick, N. H. He also said that other dividend plans are being considered for the several hundred other Bond employees in offices and stores throughout the country.

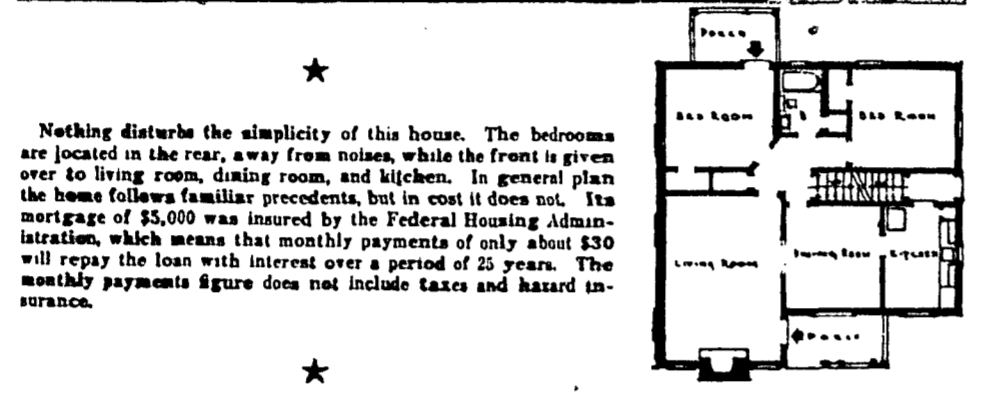
A group insurance plan has also been announced for the Bond employees. This is to be a voluntary basis with premiums to be made by employees and the firm in a proportion not yet determined.

7,000 Expected To Enroll For WPA Adult Classes

Registration for WPA Adult evening classes continues to break all records with a total registration of 6,988, according to the November report just issued by the WPA Adult Education Division of the Board of Education. This is 922 more persons enrolled than for the same period last year.

Compared with the same period last year, 77 teachers conducted 207 classes, an increase of 75 classes over 1938. Of this total attendance was 518 greater than during the same period last year.
