





Hint of the Week-EXTRA SPACE



What household ever has enough closets? Here are two ideas for providing more closet space.

Closet A is built into one corner of a story and a half home where the roof comes stantingly down and forms a bedroom ceiling. You can readily build in this type of a closet and I think no explanation is necessary, just a few two by fours and wallboard, a battendoor and trim will be needed. Then cover with wall saser and build in the necessary hook strips and shelves.

Closet B is more complicated. To begin with, you should have a room from which you may take enough space to amount to 30 or 36 inches along one whole side across this and

Erect a partition and build in two doors. The shelf arrangement, however, is ingenious. There are two rods in the central space between the doors over which clothes hangers may be hooked. Above the reds is one wide shelf for storage purposes. At each end of the closet and extending from wall to wall build in first a shoe board. This is nothing more than a 12 inch board set at an incline with a 12 Inch strip nailed to it over which you place the heels of the shoes.

The shelves are arranged above the shoe shelf, as many as you can get in. Vary the distance between shelves for hat boxes, atc. In the view of the end shelves shown above, I have cut the length of one shelf in half and built in a vertical board between two shelves. This will give you a large space for hat boxes.
