Courier Cinema Comments

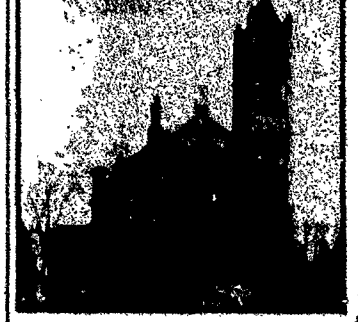
Technicolor production does make the picture vastly pleasing. "Everything Happens at Night" (A-1), presents Bonita Hunt again, but sticks on skates all too seldom in the picture. She does a combination waltz and rumba on skates which is a joy to behold—even though it is brought into the action clumsily. But for the rest of the picture, she just grins the same grin, which always causes her to resemble a well-fed kitten. Whenever there is an amusing moment in the picture—and there are quite a few—you'll find Robert Cummings largely responsible. Cummings grows increasingly expert as a comedian. "Everything Happens at Night" (and, incidentally, I would be very much obliged to anybody who could tell me what the title means)—is light, diverting, unimportant entertainment.

1,500 Rulings In Year  
On Obscene Matter

WASHINGTON. — Fifteen hundred rulings on the malleability of questionable matter were made by the Postoffice Department during the year. Postmaster General James A. Farley reveals in his annual report. The rulings were made under the section of the United States Code which prohibits transmission in the mails of any matter of an indecent, obscene, lewd, lascivious, or filthy character.

Approximately 2,000 rulings were made to postmasters under a section of the Code which makes malleable objectionable matter on the outside cover or wrapper of matter. The number of periodicals with indecent contents seeking admission to the mails decreased considerably. The report also shows that the Department, in co-operation with other agencies of the Government, maintained close watch over foreign mail. The Postmaster General said, "The result of this censorship matter addressed to residents of the United States and foreign dealers in obscene matter has been confiscated."
