

Despite the fact that the tenets of Christ have been known and taught for twenty centuries. two-thirds of the population of the world have never acknowledged Him as the Redeemer of mankind. The Holy See, then, beggs a place in our daily prayers in the month of February for those less fortunate than ourselves, the nations of mission lands.

February, Catholio Press Month is a period which should be of particular interest to readers of this column. Pope Plus XII who as Papal Secretary of State addressed the Press convention attembaled an Rome in 1936 said The hour of battle is now The field of the struggle is the resurgence of the old worship of false gods, the antag-onism arisin between reason and the senses, between ideologistic fantanes and the authentia revelation of fled. between Nero and Peter between Christ and Pilats. The struggle is not new. It is the hour only that is new. But the vigilant 'Shepherd of the Church who guide us.' the episcopate, is on guard, and you, who with such steady eyes gazing out over the world, feed its oppressive burden. And so you are animated to enter the struggle after the manner of great captains who, with their field glasses, spy out enemy so as to fire the moment and arrangement of battle." Cortainly such attering words, uitared by the present Supresse Shepherd of the Fold of the Catholic Church impose a mighty task upon the editors of the press of that Church. They must be endowed with a clarity of vision capable of differentialing but een the unadorned besures of bet ean the unadorned beauty of truth and the glampour of falsehood. They must be inspired by a spirit of charity which is un-influenced by the boundary lines of race, owder or politics. They must be clothed in the armour of courage willing to face the enrepresentation of Incia, remaining above the insistency of paid propagan

In addressing the delegates to the last Contholic Press Conven-tion in Naw York, Architchep speliman summarized these re-quirements when he sides "I encourage Catholic editors, Cath-olic writers, to continue as they have done to spread the smape of Christ, to spread the gospet of charity. Just as individuals have temptations, so too have writers temptations and semetimes write ers prefar to sacrifice some of the truth to the way of supress-ing an idea brilliantly. It is all right and commendable to exnot right to encrifice one lota of the truth for brilliancy lists I commend to you the obligation, the responsibility and the God-blessed mission of making the voice of Catholic Action articulate."


