The bride is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John Lynah of Auburn and the bridegroom is the son of Charles Carbonaro, also of this city.

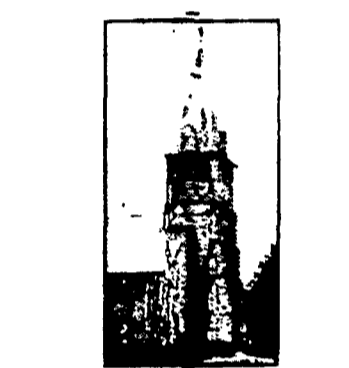
