

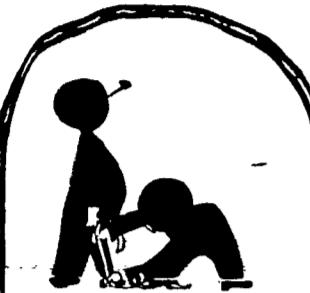

NATION-WIDE EDUCATION MEET 'FELLOW TRAVELERS' WAKE UP

Bishop Kearney To Address N. C. E. A. On Civic Training

WASHINGTON—(N. C.)—"Civic Education in the Elementary School" is the subject of a paper the Most Rev. James E. Kearney, Bishop of Rochester, will present to the Parish School Department at the thirty seventh annual meeting of the National Catholic Educational Association, to be held at Kansas City Mo., March 27, 28 and 29, it is announced.

World Needs More 'Psycho-Synthesis'

NEW YORK (NC) - There is needed in the world of today a little less psychoanalysis and a little more "psycho-synthesis" declared the Rt Rev. Magr. Fulton J. Sheen last night in his address over the "Catholic Hour."

Beginning the second part of his current series, Monsignor Sheen stressed that after treating of "Peace and the World," he would in the next few weeks discuss "Peace and the Soul," by correlating the Seven Last Words of Our Lord on Calvary with the Seven Virtues and presenting typical attitudes of souls in the face of the problem of personal peace.

Need for Pattern "Hearts and minds have been analyzed to a point where they are nothing more than a chaotic mass of unrelated nerve impulses," he said. "There is a need for someone to pull them together to give them a pattern of life and above all, peace. The pattern around which I shall say, psycho-synthesis, all these soul-states will be the Cross."

Monsignor Sheen urged the Virtue of Fortitude for souls that suffer complainingly, those that deny or hide the faith they possess and those that do not possess faith, but are convinced of its truth and will not pay the price for it.

"Continuing Monsignor Sheen asserted that Our Lord exemplified super-natural fortitude on the Cross when He said, "Father forgive them for they know not what they do." He declared that the Virtue of Fortitude reaches its peak in the life of Our Divine Lord Who "came into this world to live but to die on the Cross." The First Word Monsignor Sheen asserted the Saviour brought Fortitude to the height of self-forgetfulness, thinking only of others and their salvation. If He were only a man He would have said, "My own forgiveness." Monsignor Sheen added "but being God He asked His Father for the pardon of man."

Applying this example to souls Monsignor Sheen said those who suffer most realize that in this world there is no intrinsic connection between personal sin and suffering and that by the virtue of Patience which is closely allied with Fortitude, they resign themselves to the will of God as did the Redeemer on Golgotha. "Our Lord on the Cross practiced Fortitude," he said, "by freely and fearlessly meeting death to purchase our forgiveness. He practiced Patience by passively accepting the Father's will."

Aids Souls Ashamed The virtue of Fortitude is beneficial to souls ashamed to admit their faults, Monsignor Sheen went on, because it gives them courage to face the scorn of the world for their profession of belief, a scorn which Our Lord suffered, he said, because in the First Word He being thoughtful of death for the sake of our forgiveness, taught us to be thoughtful of the world's scorn for the sake of being forgiven.

Scorn is also the price of conversion, Monsignor Sheen, saying that "the only religion which will help the world is one which contradicts the world."

"That is why this series begins with the Virtue of Fortitude," he said. "It is a call to the strong for it takes courage to face the Cross as the pattern of life. Because the Cross is uncompromising and because there is no winking in virtue, this series on the Cross may not be popular, but I trust that it will at least be Christlike."

Reds' 'Fellow Travellers' Begin To See The Light

Eyes of the "fellow travellers" of the deep-dyed Red regime in Soviet Russia have been fully opened, current dispatches of the N.C.W.C. News Service reveal. These are the people who during the Spanish Civil War were repeatedly denying charges in the Catholic Press that they acted for Spain were controlled by Communism. The American League for Peace and Democracy chief supporter in this country of the Spanish Loyalist faction in the civil war there has been disbanded by its national board of directors as it reported from New York. This was the outfit which in its stormy career frequently shifted its stated objectives and its tactics. The organization, formerly known as the League Against War and Fascism, it was repeatedly charged with being openly sympathetic toward Soviet Russia and international Communism. A Communist front? The disbanded followed charges made by the Dies Committee in Washington. American Activities League the League was a Communist front. Of course Dr. Harry F. Ward, head of the League since 1934, denies that the League was Communist-controlled. The Doctor who is also president of the American Civil Liberties Union asserted that the League "did not tolerate control by Communism." Neither, he said, did the Communists "desire to control the League. The Catholic Press disproved this many times in articles while the Spanish War was in progress. He says that despite the disbandment of the League the members will continue to work in defense of democratic rights and to keep this country out of war. Mellich Epstein, prominent New York Communist leader and former editor of the Morning Freiheit, said last week that the bullying of small nations and the aggression against Finland, together with the Nazi-Soviet non-aggression pact, are breaking up the Communist party. Speaking to two meetings of Jews in the Workmen's Circle Club the former Editor of the Morning Freiheit New York Communist daily paper, said the Russian Communist Party has driven many Communists throughout the world from the party and into anti-Fascist groups. Stalin Betrayed Them. "Thus are the 'fellow-travellers' being told what the Catholic Press has repeatedly been stating for the past three years. This speaker said that the Communists feel that Stalin has betrayed the proletariat in Russia's recent imperialism and charged that the Soviet regime has become a dictatorship over the proletariat and the membership of the Communist Party. "That those who have been fooled in this country are coming to a full realization is shown in John Hayes Holmes recent address to the congregation of the Community Church in New York's Town Hall. Said Mr. Holmes, prominent Protestant Liberal, "I feel that I have deceived myself, as well as been deceived." "If we liberals were right on certain single aspects of the Russian Revolution, we were wrong, disgracefully wrong, on the question as a whole," declared Mr. Holmes. "We were wrong because in our enthusiasm over Russia's liberation from the Czar, our hope for the further liberation of the Russian people from economic as well as political serfdom and our vision of a new world springing from the womb of this Russian experiment, we permitted ourselves to condone wrongs that we knew to be wrong. "We consented to violations of principle that we knew to be fatal to the moral integrity of mankind. Dismal Ideas. "We defended, or at least apologized for, evils in the case of Russia which horrified us wherever else they appeared, and by whomsoever else they were done. We accepted covertly, if not openly,
